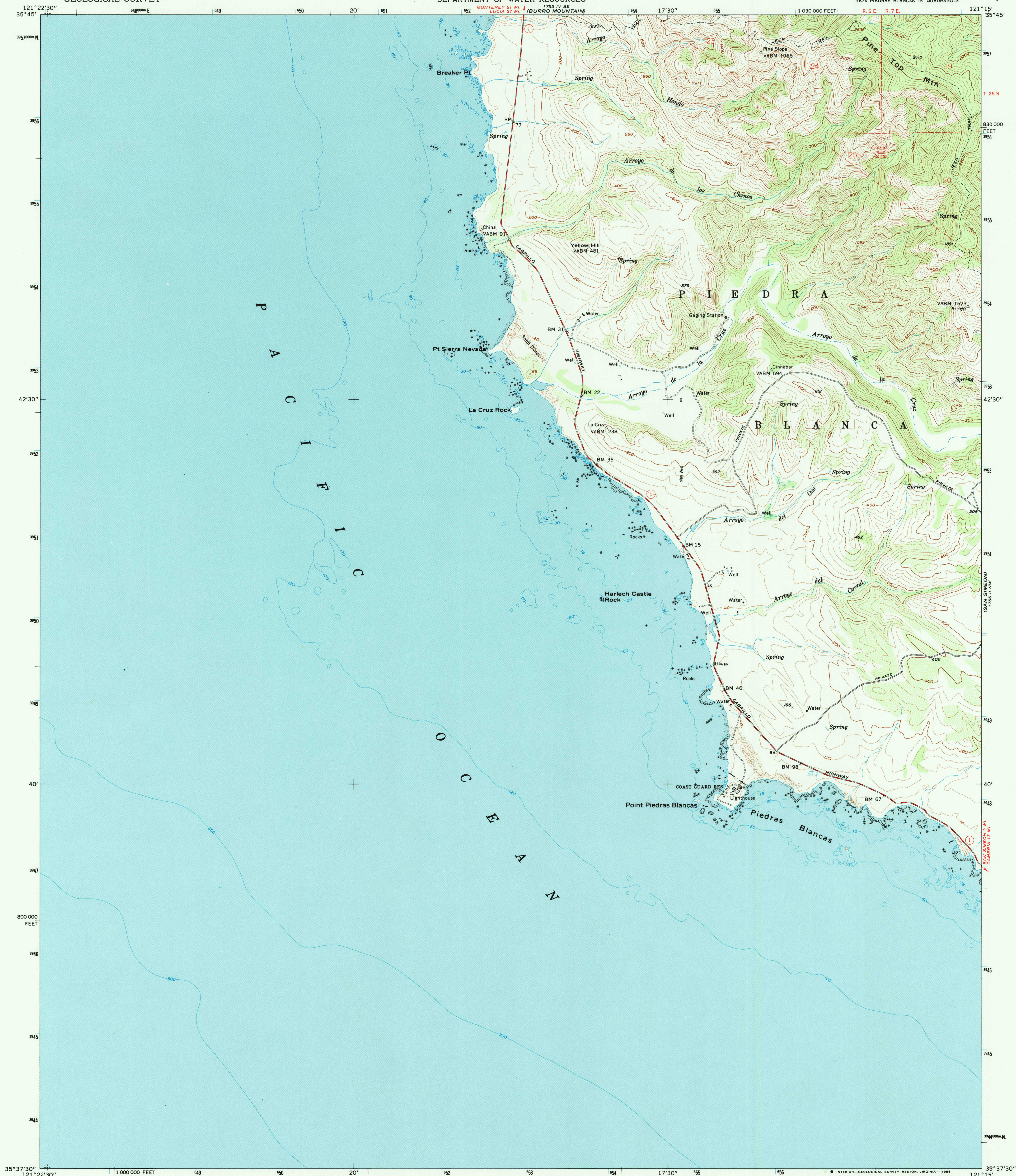

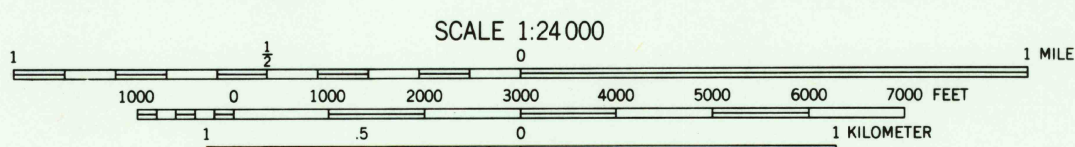
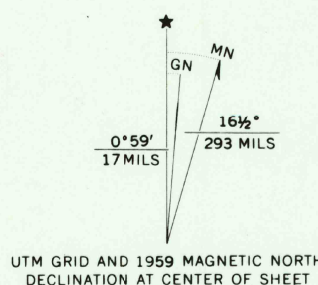

10,000-foot grid based on California coordinate system, zone 5
1000-meter Universal Transverse Mercator grid ticks,
zone 10, shown in blue

To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983
move the projection lines 8 meters north and
91 meters east as shown by dashed corner ticks
Dashed land lines indicate approximate locations
Unchecked elevations are shown in brown

THE MEAN RANGE OF TIDE IS APPROXIMATELY 4 FEET
