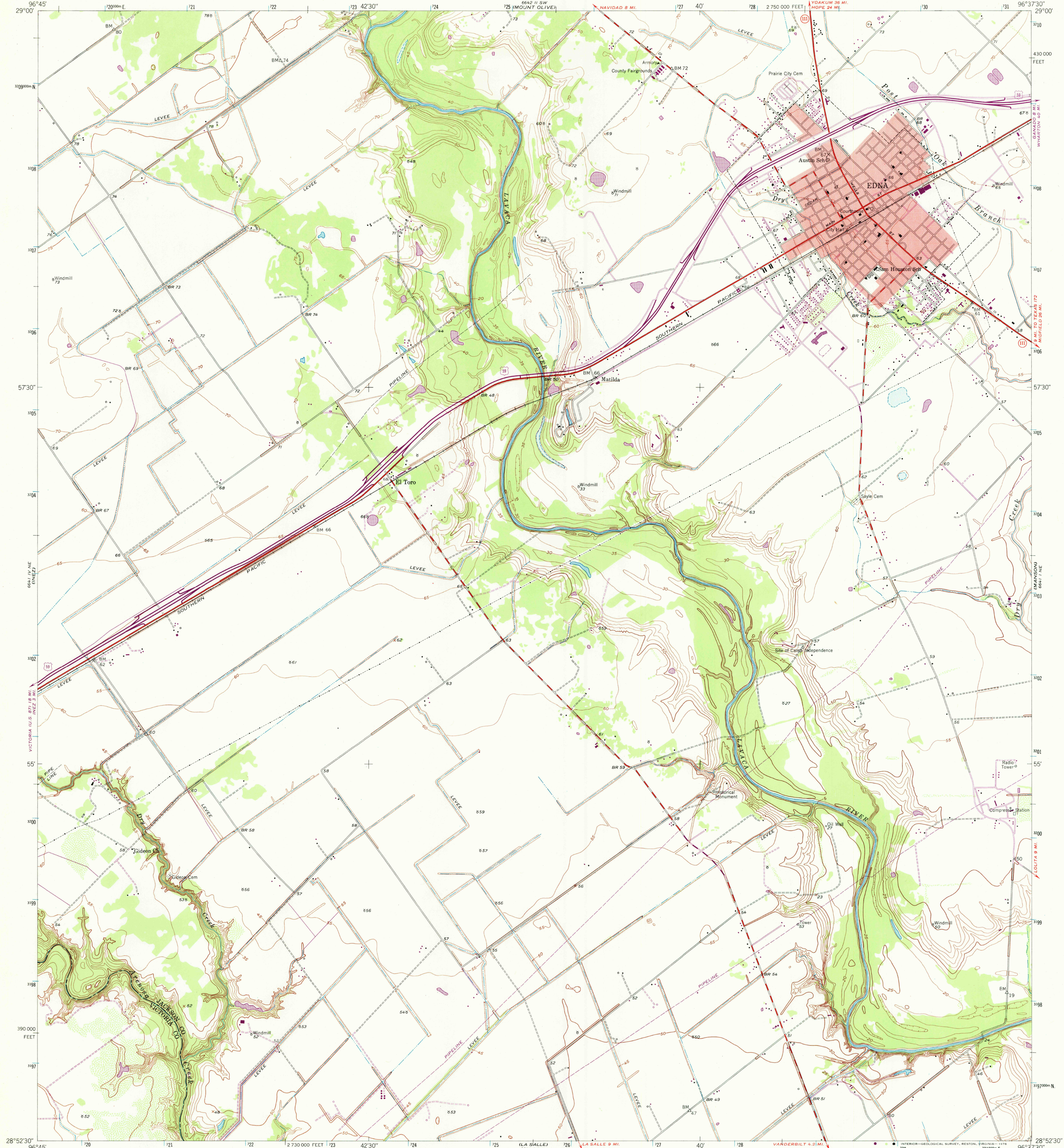

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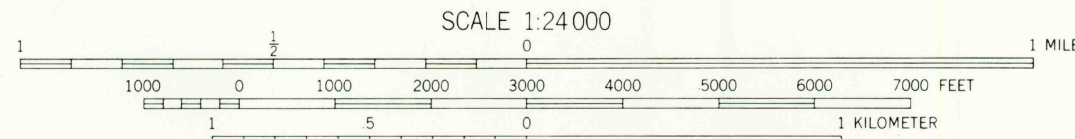
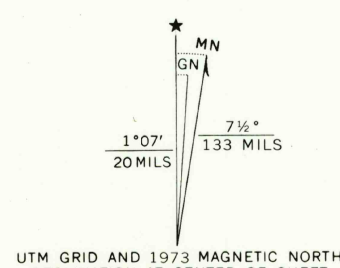
Culture and drainage in part compiled from aerial photographs taken 1946-1947. Topography by plane-table surveys 1952
