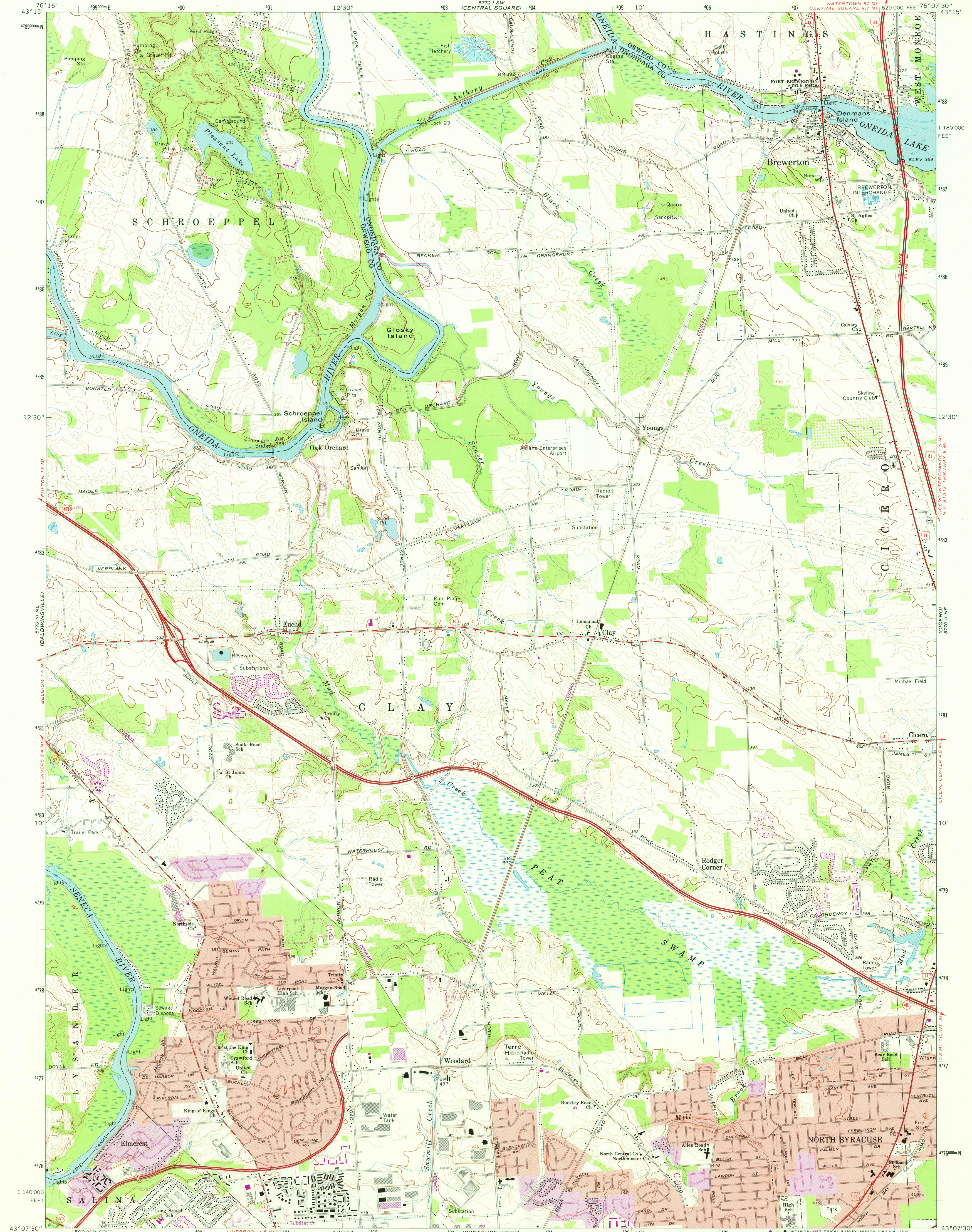

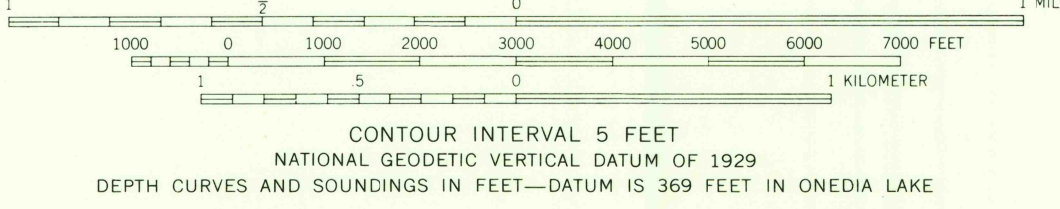
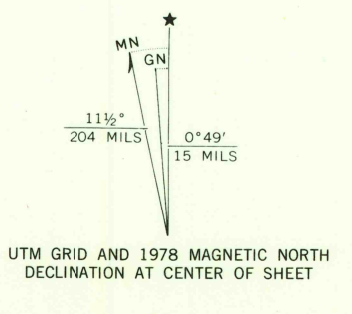

1000-meter Universal Transverse Mercator grid ticks, zone 18, shown in blue. 1927 North American datum

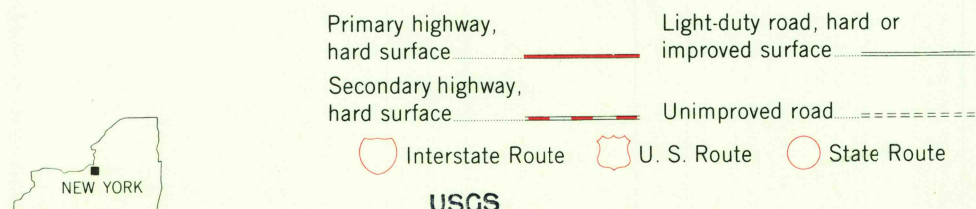
Fine red dashed lines indicate selected fence and field lines where generally visible on aerial photographs. This information is unchecked
