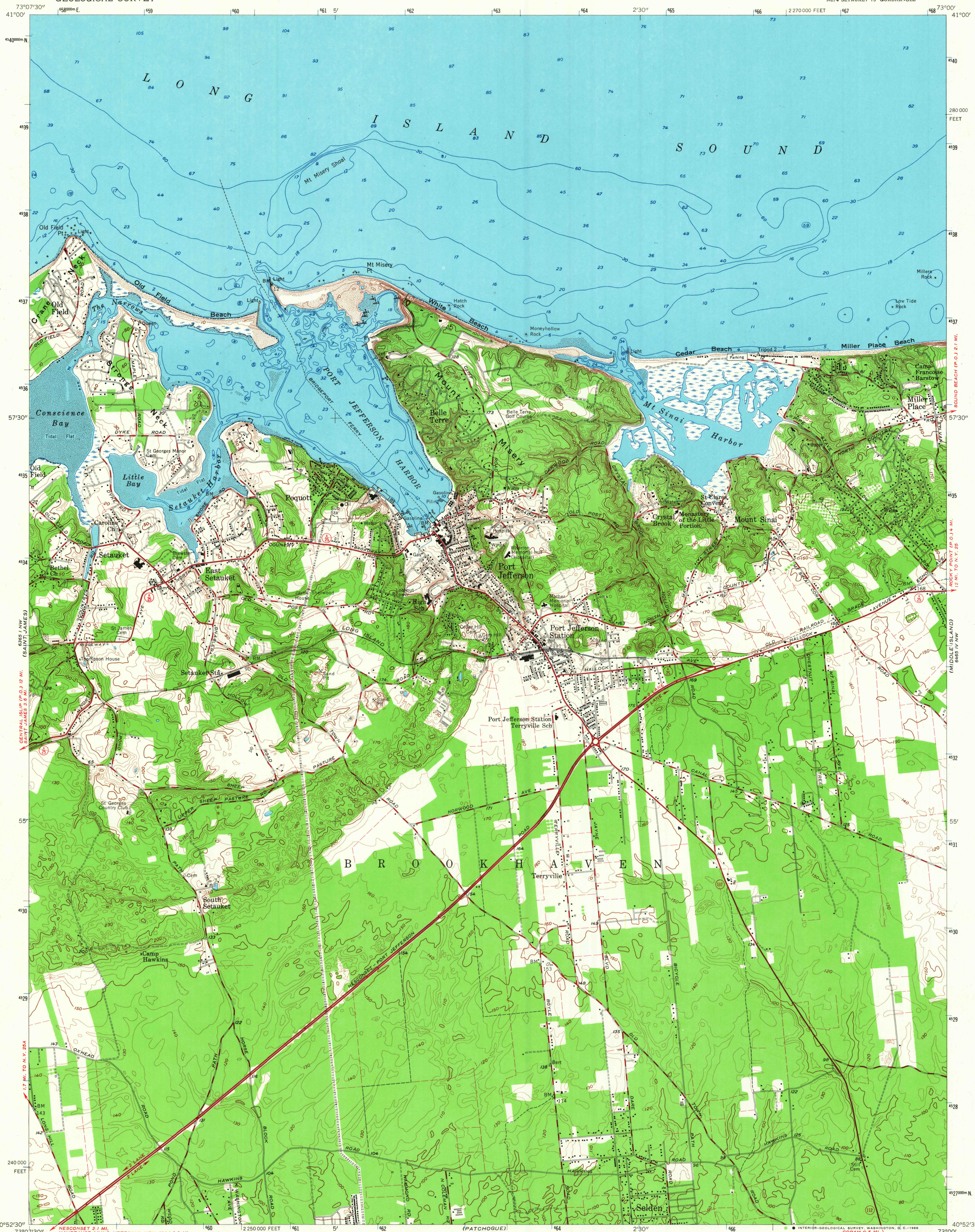

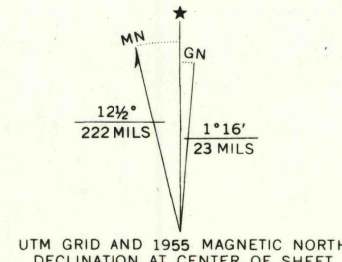
Polyconic projection. 1927 North American datum

DATUM IS MEAN SEA LEVEL

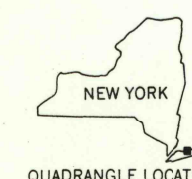
DEPTH CURVES AND SOUNDINGS IN FEET-DATUM IS MEAN LOW WATER
