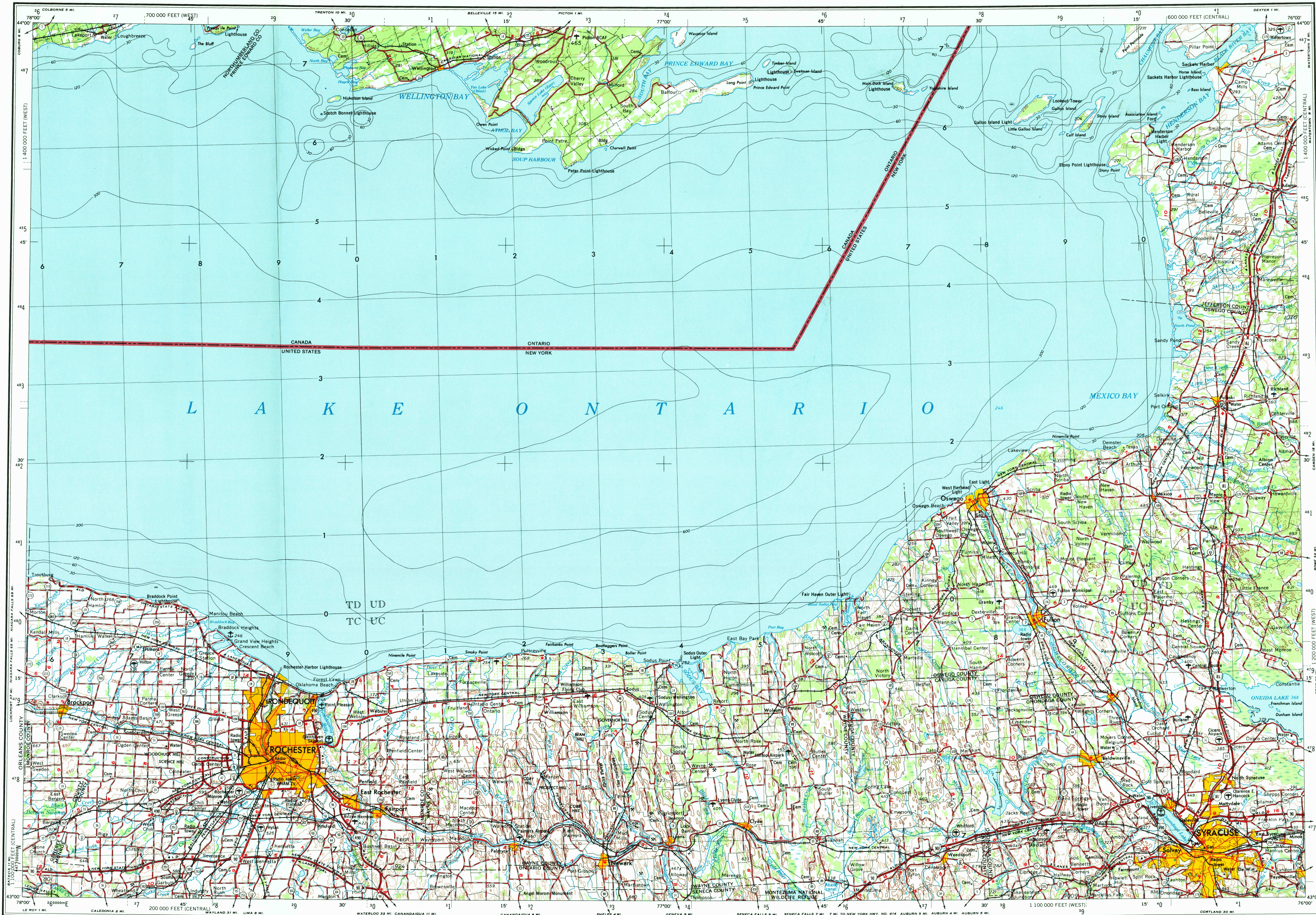

GRID ZONE DESIGNATION

18T

TO GIVE A STANDARD REFERENCE ON THIS SHEET TO NEAREST 1000 METERS

SAMPLE POINT: SODAS POINT

1. Read letters identifying 100,000 meter square in which the point lies

2. Locate first VERTICAL and line to LEFT of point and read LARGE figure labeling the line either in the top or bottom margin or on the line itself, and line BELOW point and read line to point

3. Locate first HORIZONTAL and line to RIGHT margin or on the line itself

4. Estimate tenths from line to point
