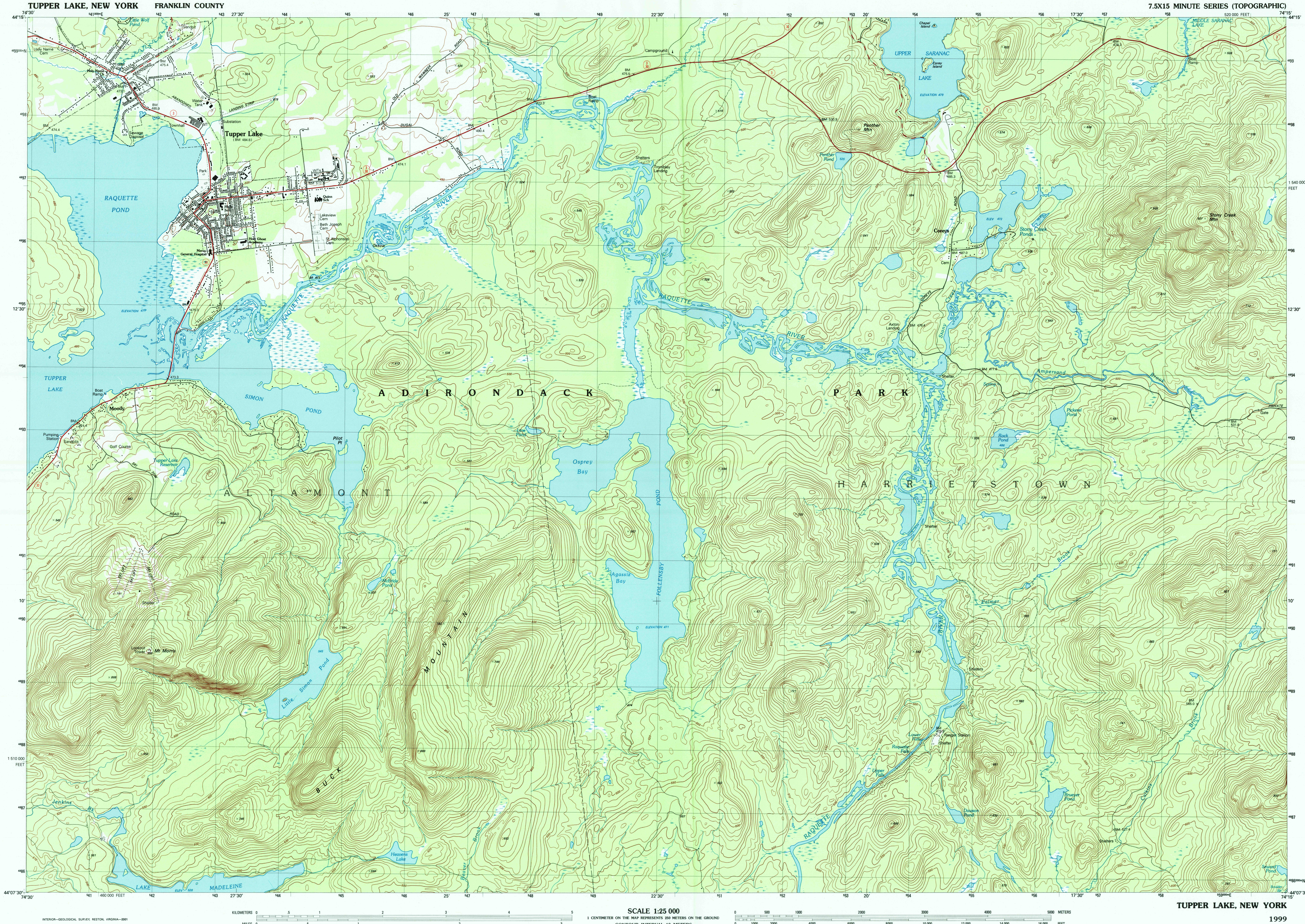
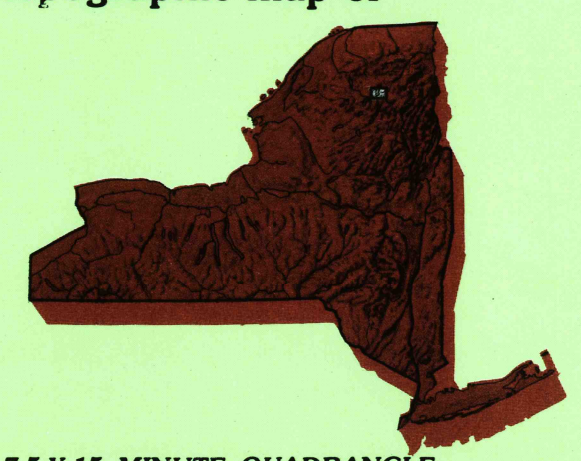






Tupper Lake NEW YORK
