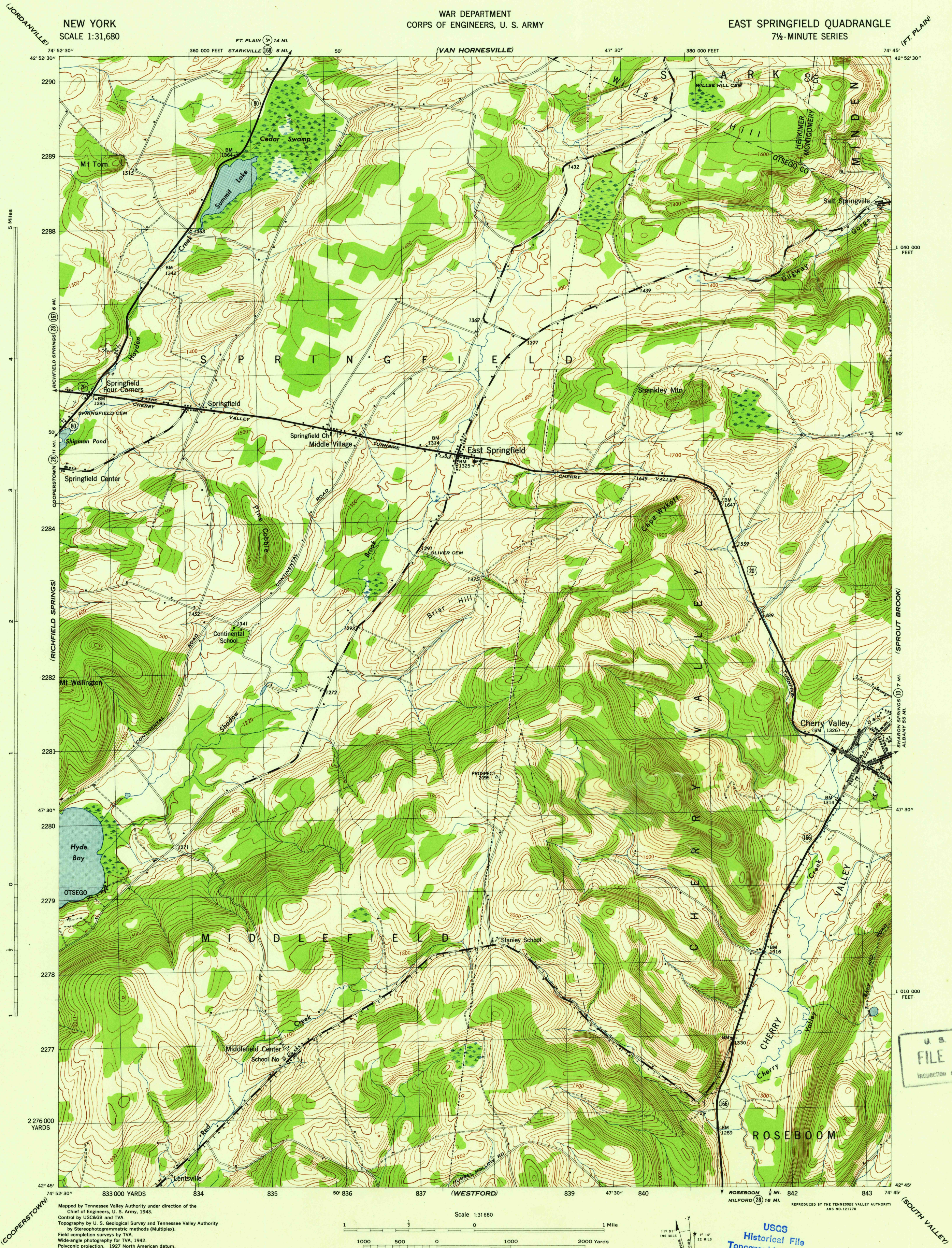

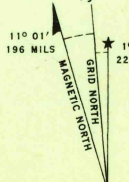

Secondary, hard-surface, all-weather road. Dirt road. State Route
More than two lanes indicated by note along road with tick at point of change. 3 LANE 1 & 2 LANE
