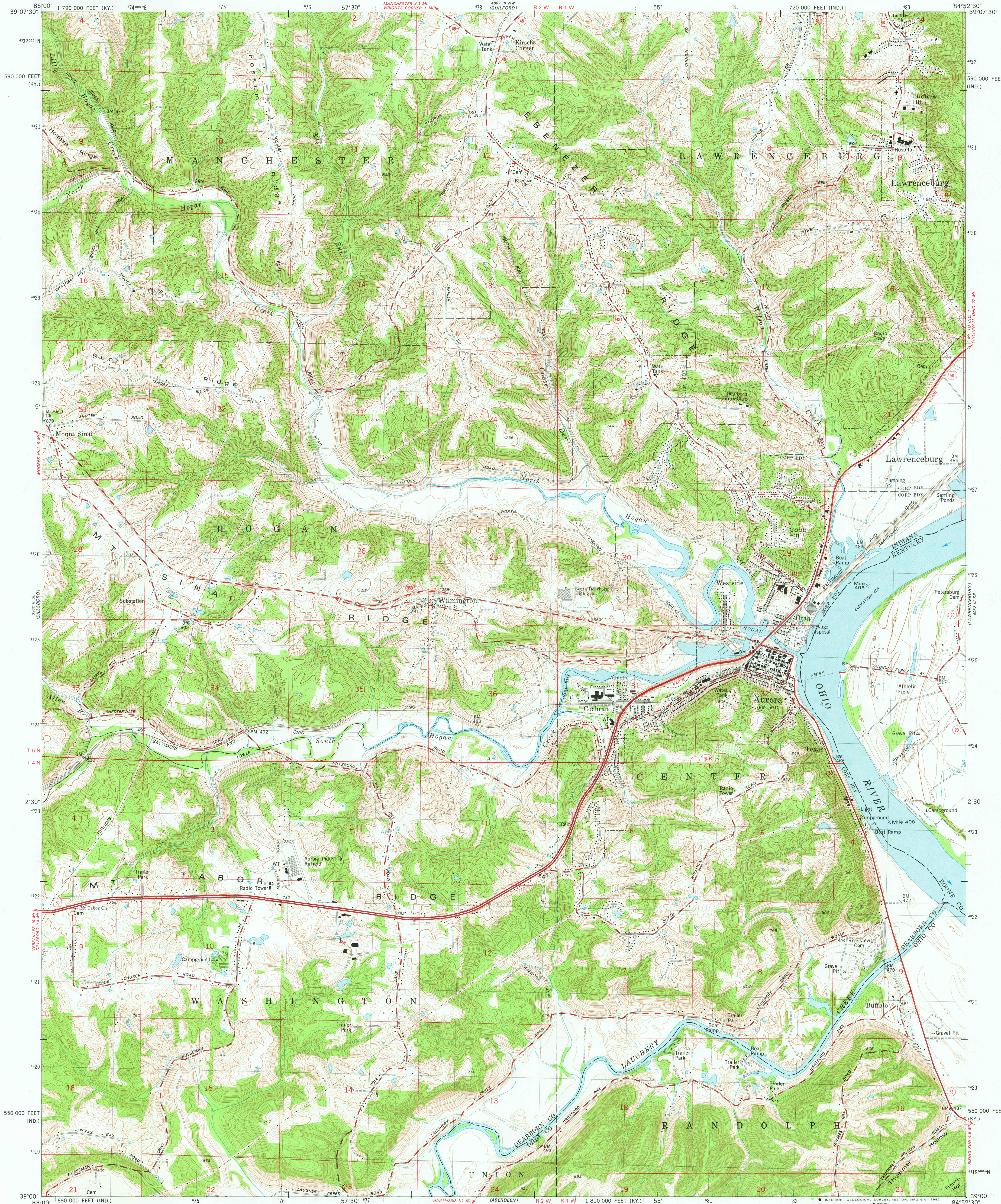
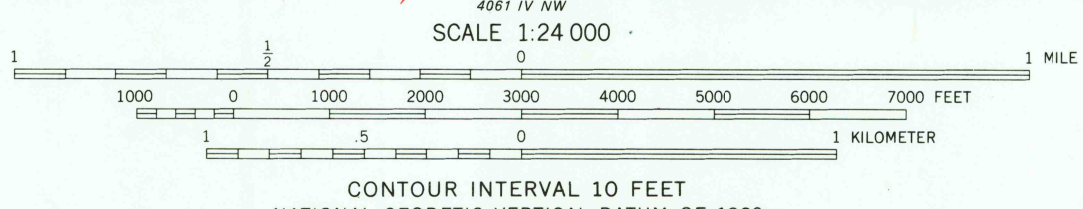
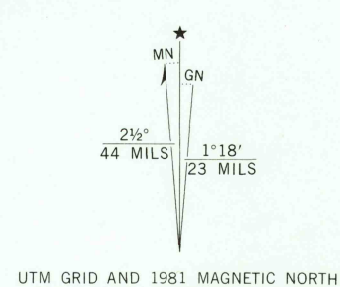

Revised from aerial photographs taken 1977. Field checked 1978. Map edited 1981. Polyconic projection. 10,000-foot grid ticks based on Indiana coordinate system, east zone, and Kentucky coordinate system, north zone 1000 meter Universal Transverse Mercator grid, zone 16. 1927 North American Datum. To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983 move the projection lines 3 meters south and 4 meters west as shown by dashed corner ticks. Fine red dashed lines indicate selected fence and field lines where generally visible on aerial photographs. This information is unchecked. The state boundary as shown represents the approximate position of the low water line as determined from U. S. Corps of Engineers Ohio River charts, surveyed 1911-1914, and supplementary information.
