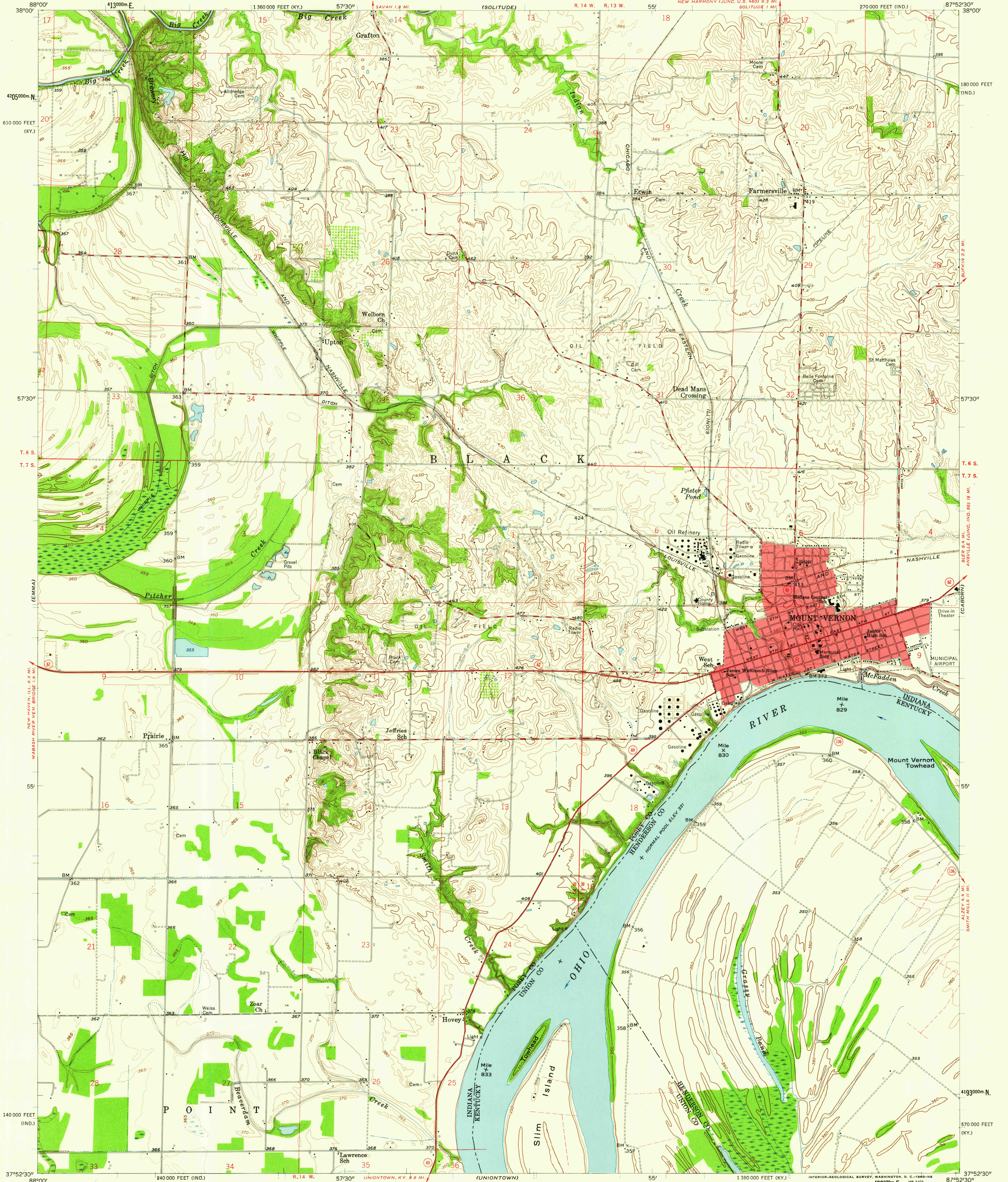

Polyconic projection. 1927 North American datum 10,000-foot grids based on Indiana coordinate system, west zone, and Kentucky coordinate system, south zone. 1000-meter Universal Transverse Mercator grid ticks, zone 16, shown in blue. Fine red dashed lines indicate selected fence and field lines visible on aerial photographs. This information is unchecked. All wells are oil wells. Red tint indicates area in which only landmark buildings are shown.

The state boundary as shown represents the approximate position of the low waterline as determined from U. S. Corps of Engineers Ohio River charts, surveyed 1912-1913, and supplementary information.
