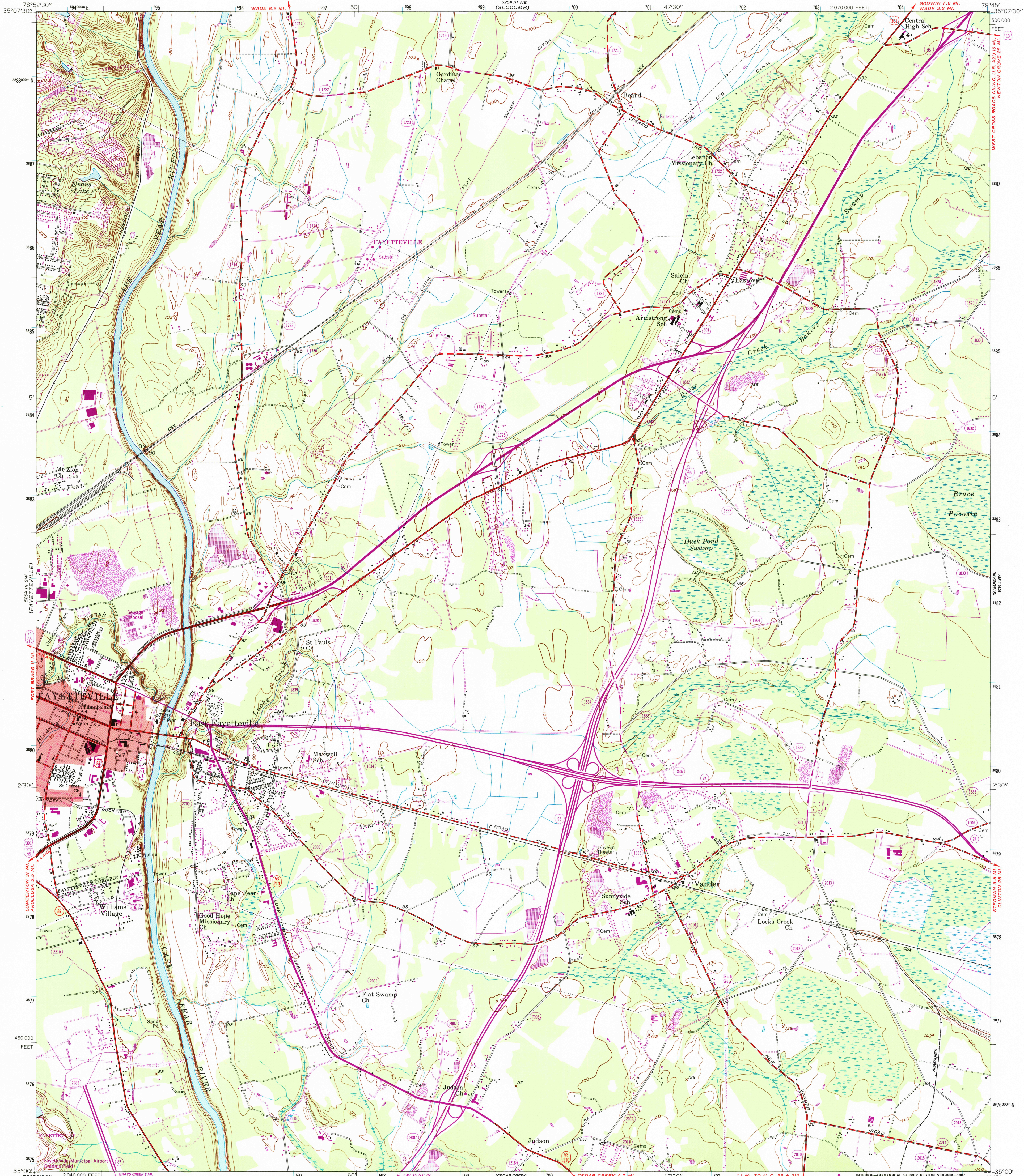

To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983 move the projection lines 12 meters south and 23 meters west as shown by dashed corner ticks
Red tint indicates area in which only landmark buildings are shown
