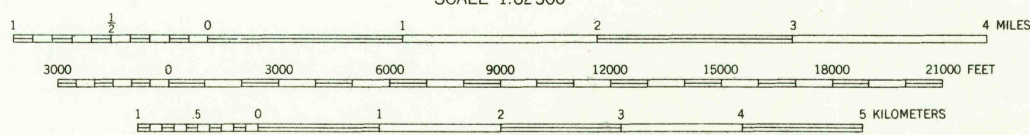

landmark buildings are shown

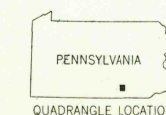
