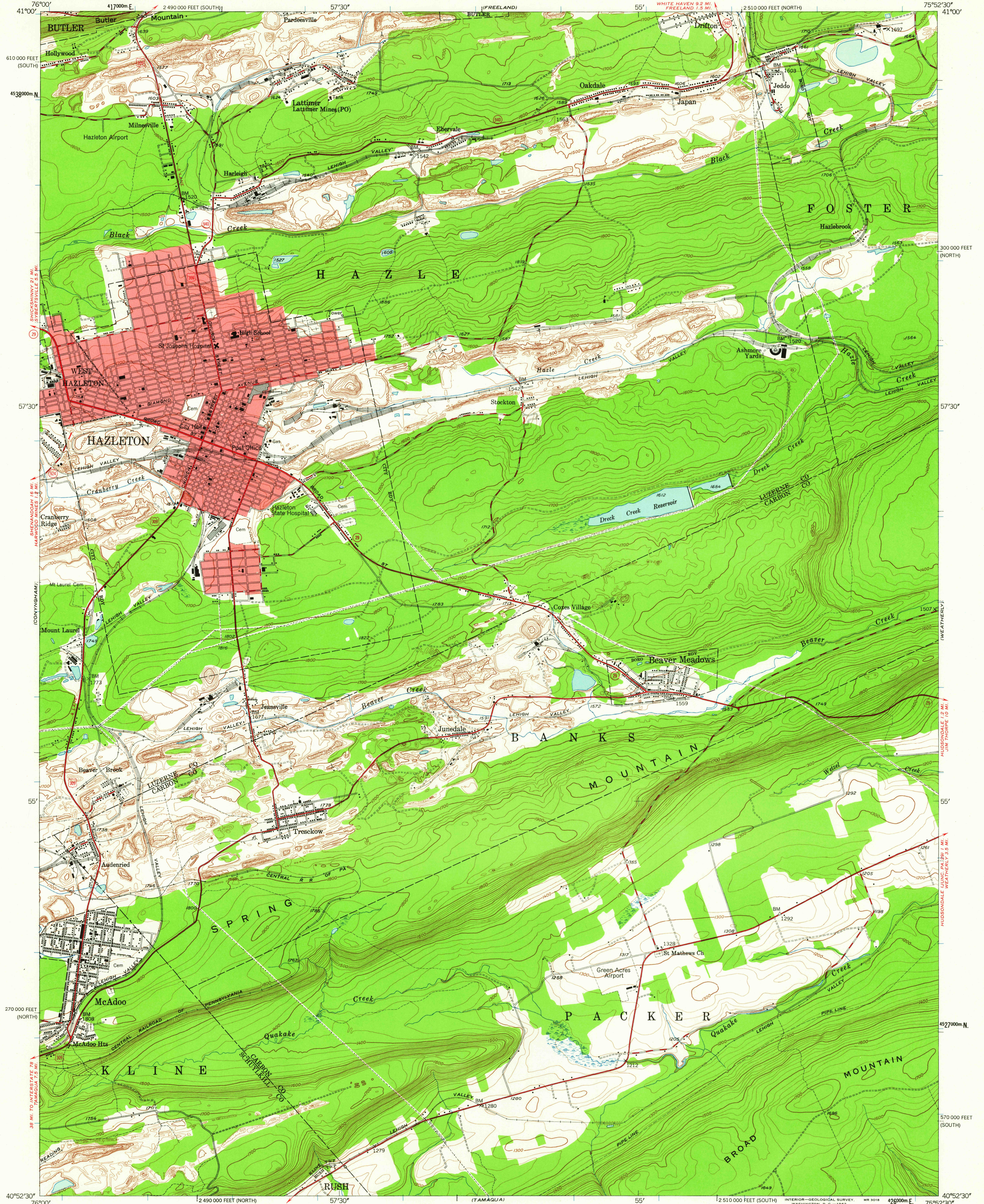

north and south zones

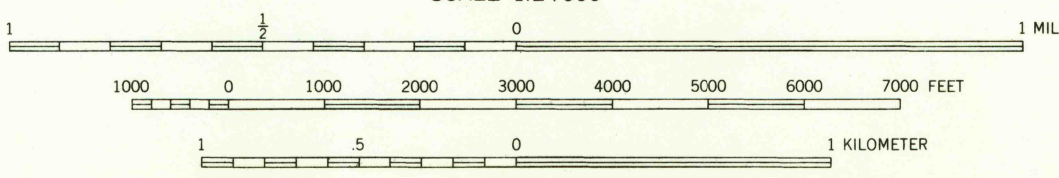
Red tint indicates area in which only

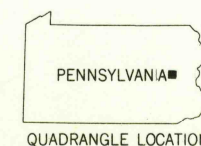
