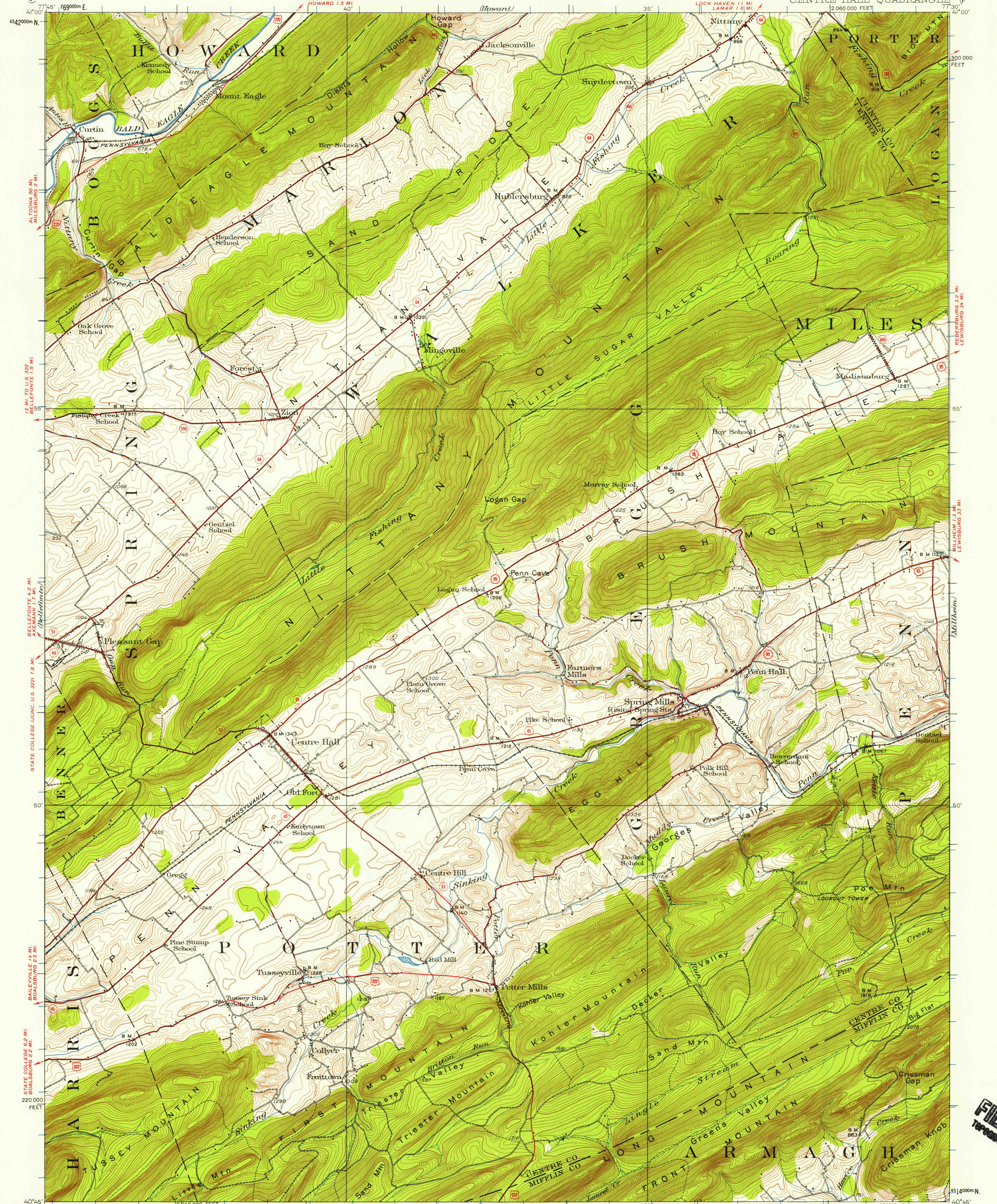

CENTRE HALL QUADRANGLE

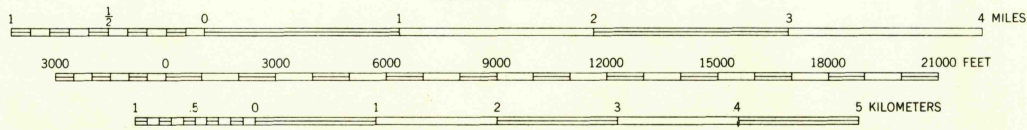
