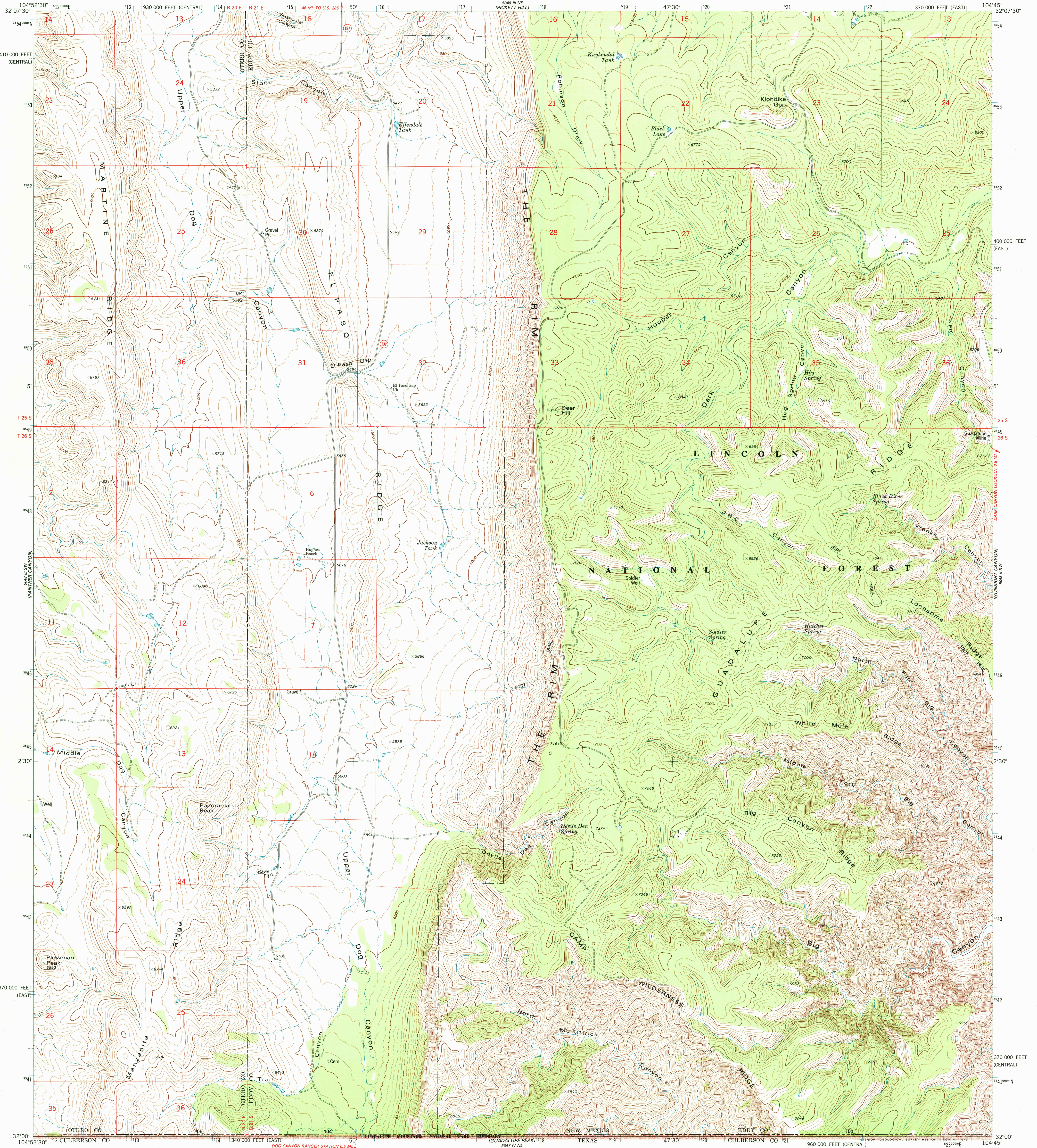

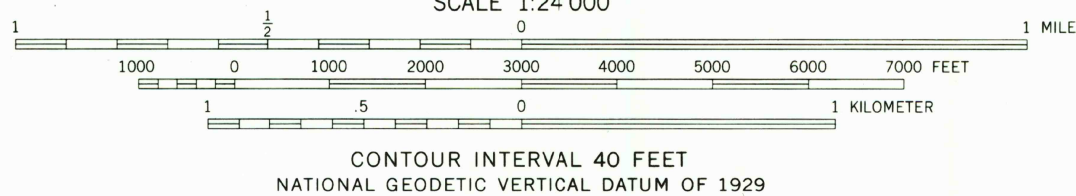
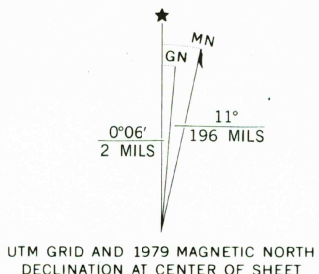
10,000-foot grid ticks based on New Mexico coordinate system, east and central zones
