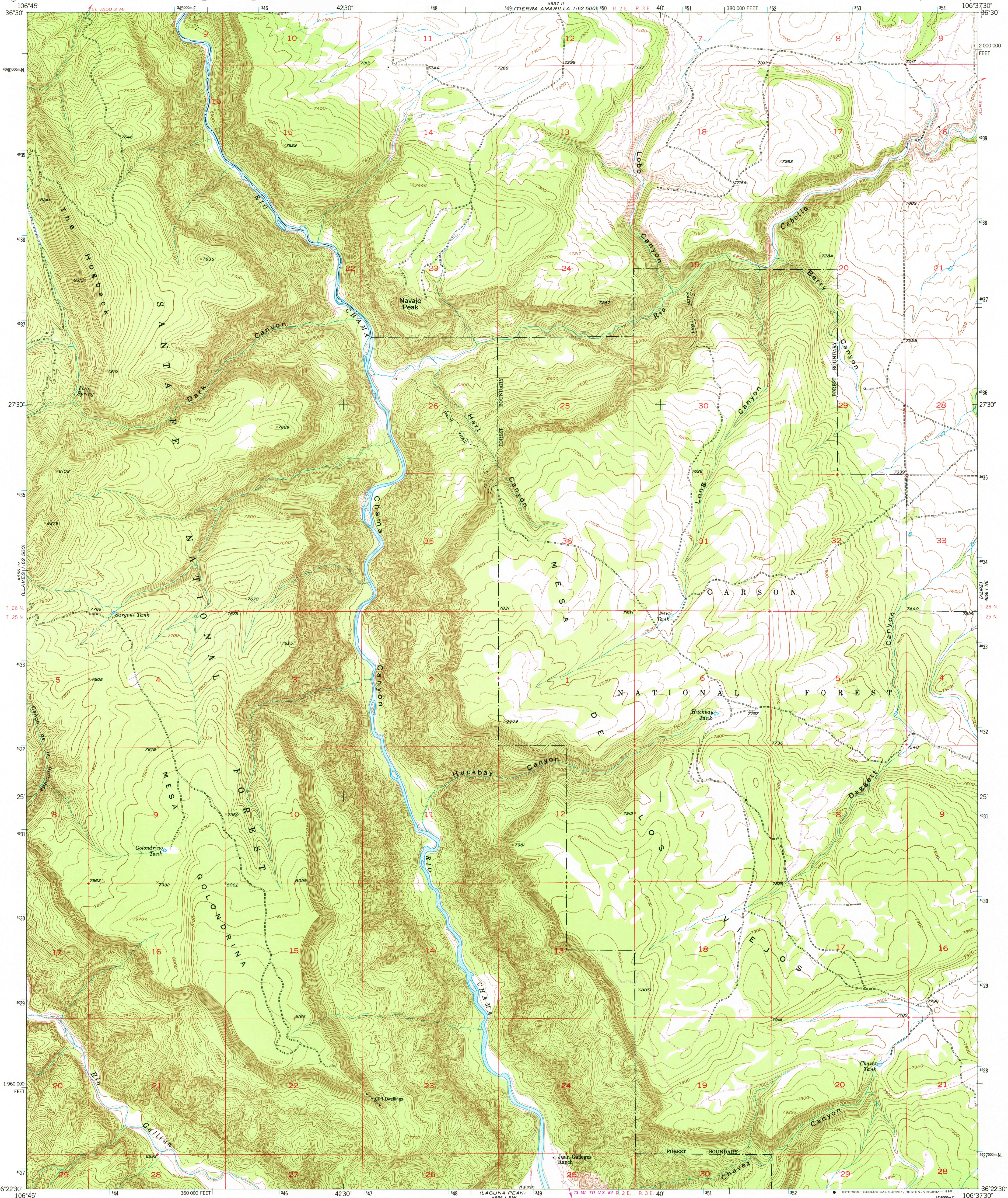

central zone

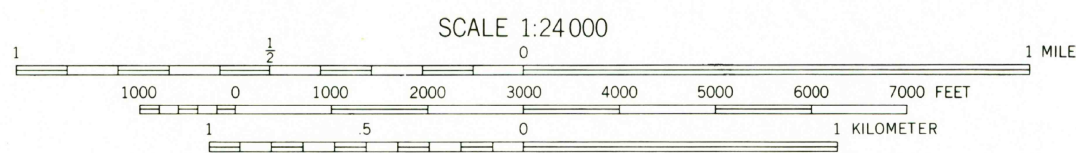
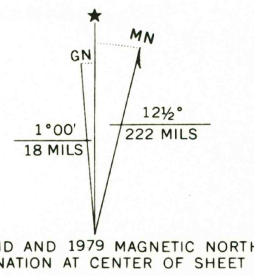
