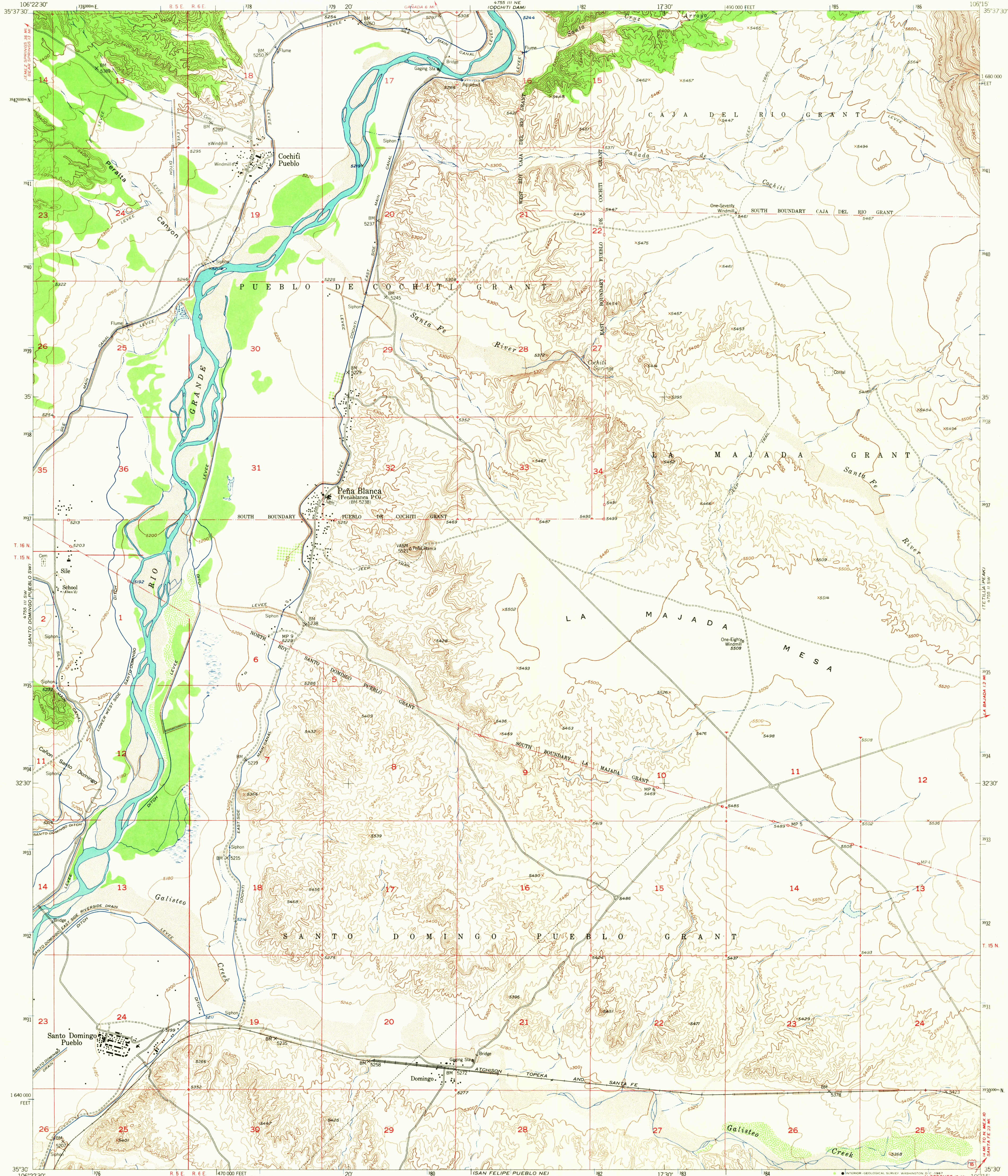




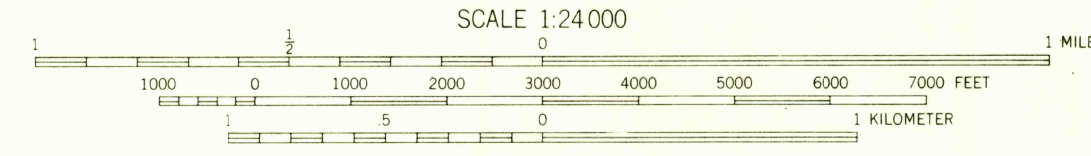
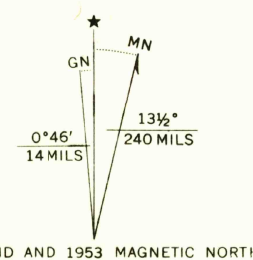

central zone

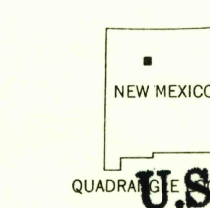
West boundary of La Majada Grant adjacent to Rio Grande
