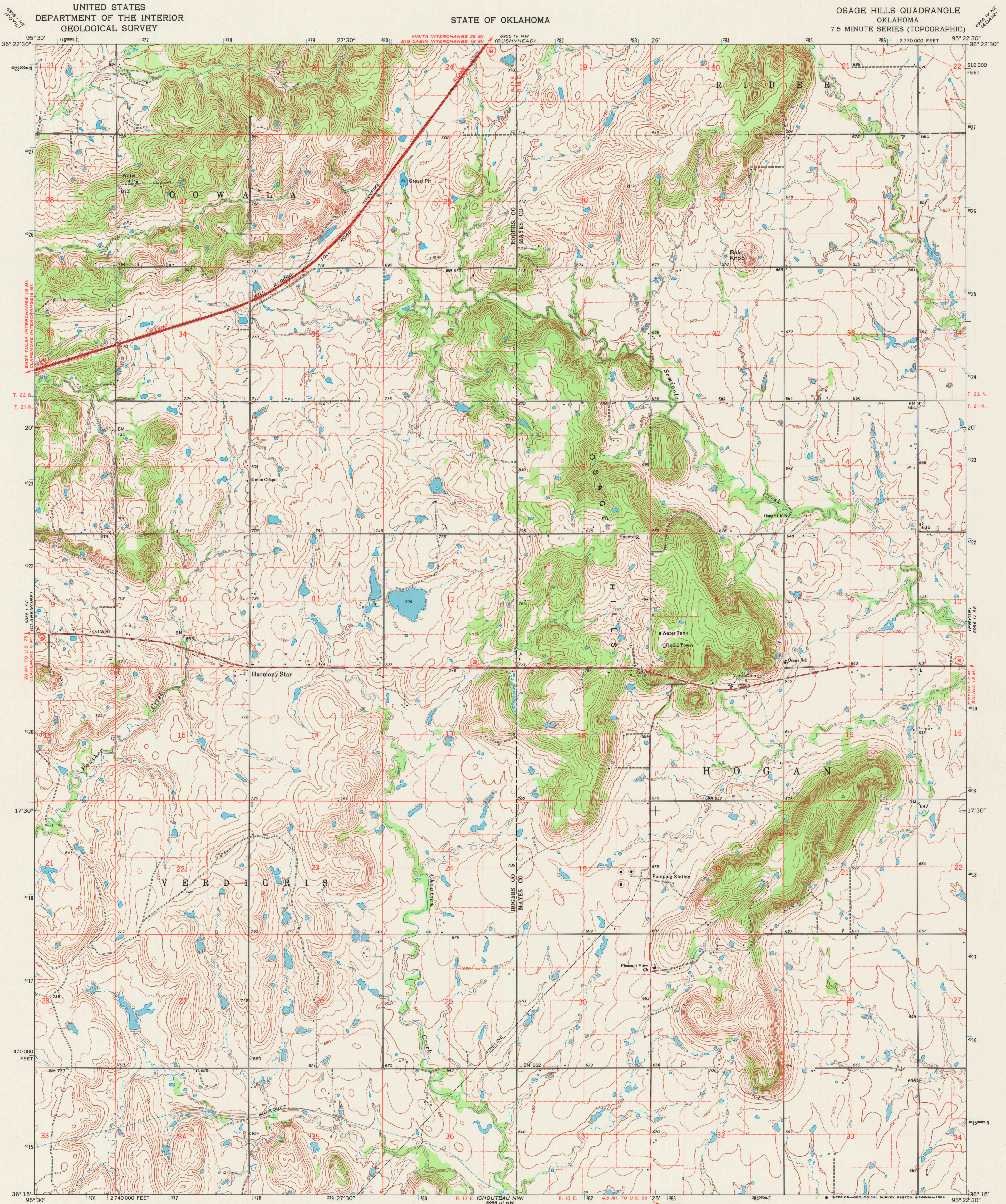

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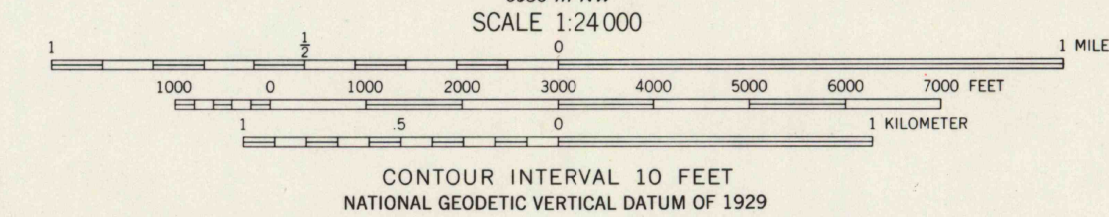
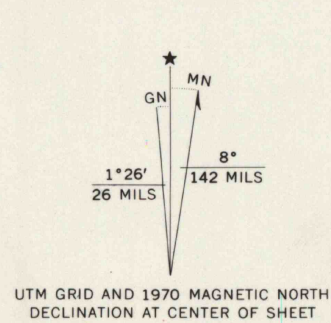
Topography by photogrammetric methods from aerial photographs taken 1968. Field checked 1970

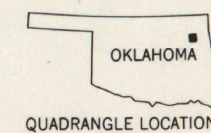
To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983, move the projection lines 4 meters south and 22 meters east as shown by dashed corner ticks
