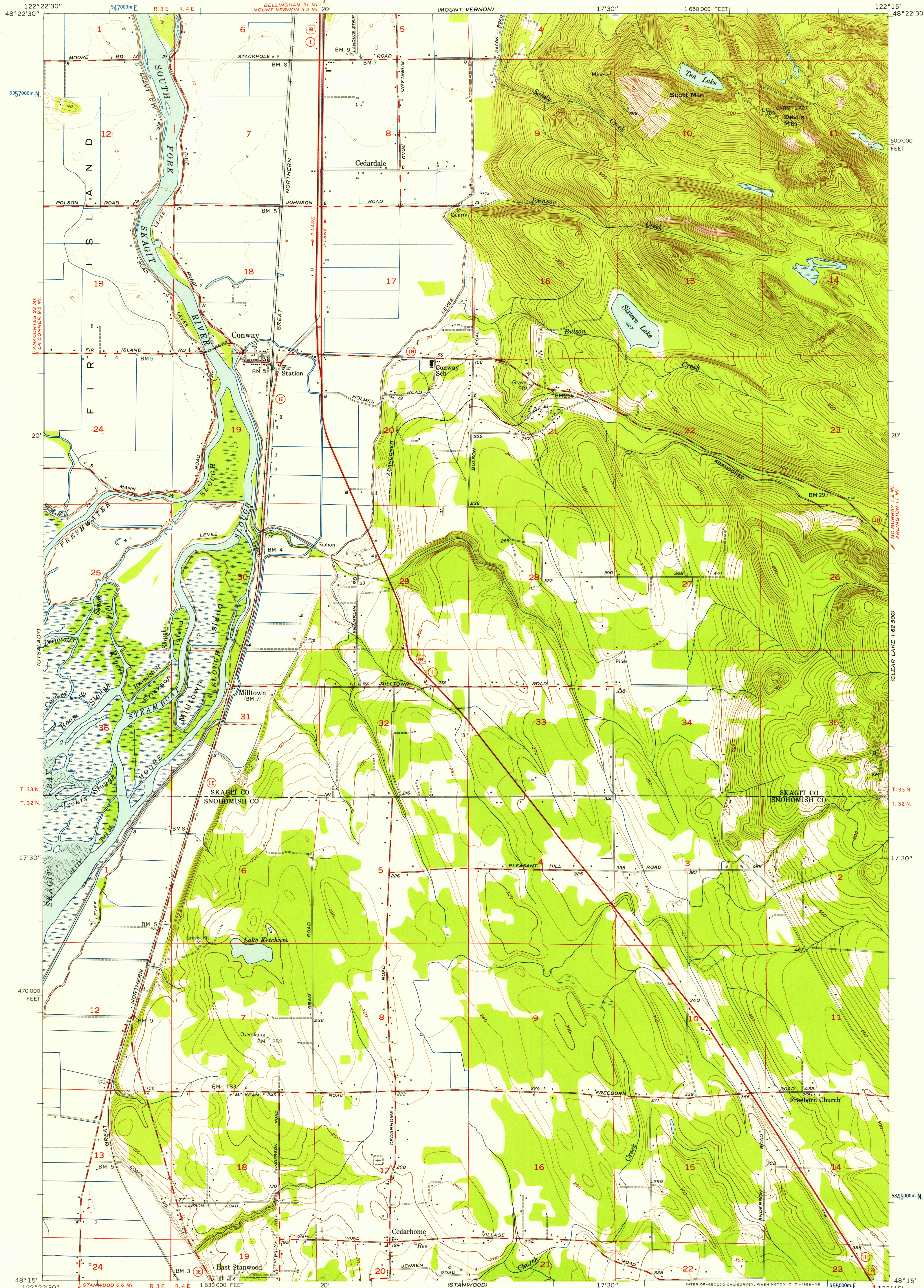

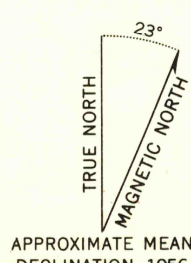

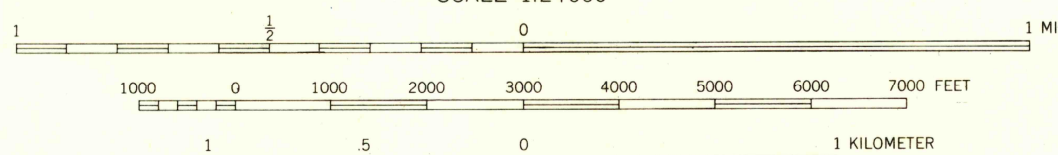
Polyconic projection. 1927 North American datum

Dashed land lines indicate approximate locations

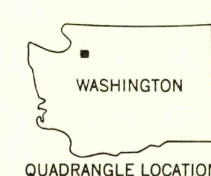
