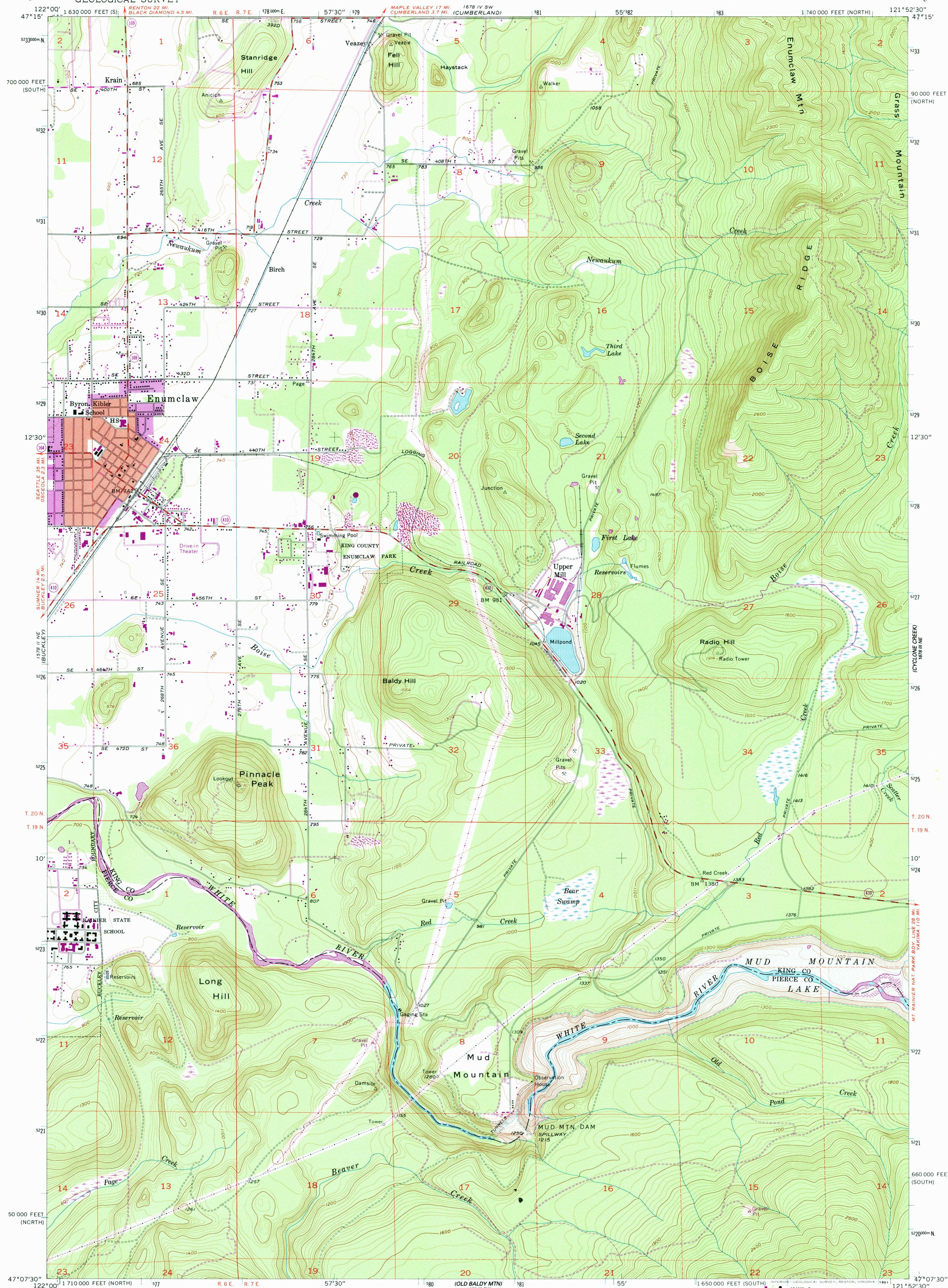

Unchecked elevations are shown in brown

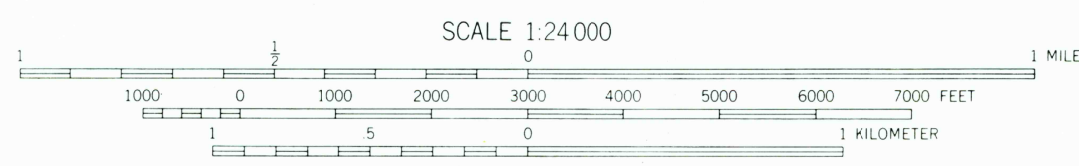
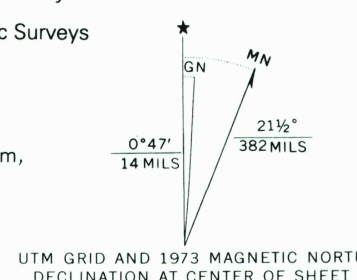
