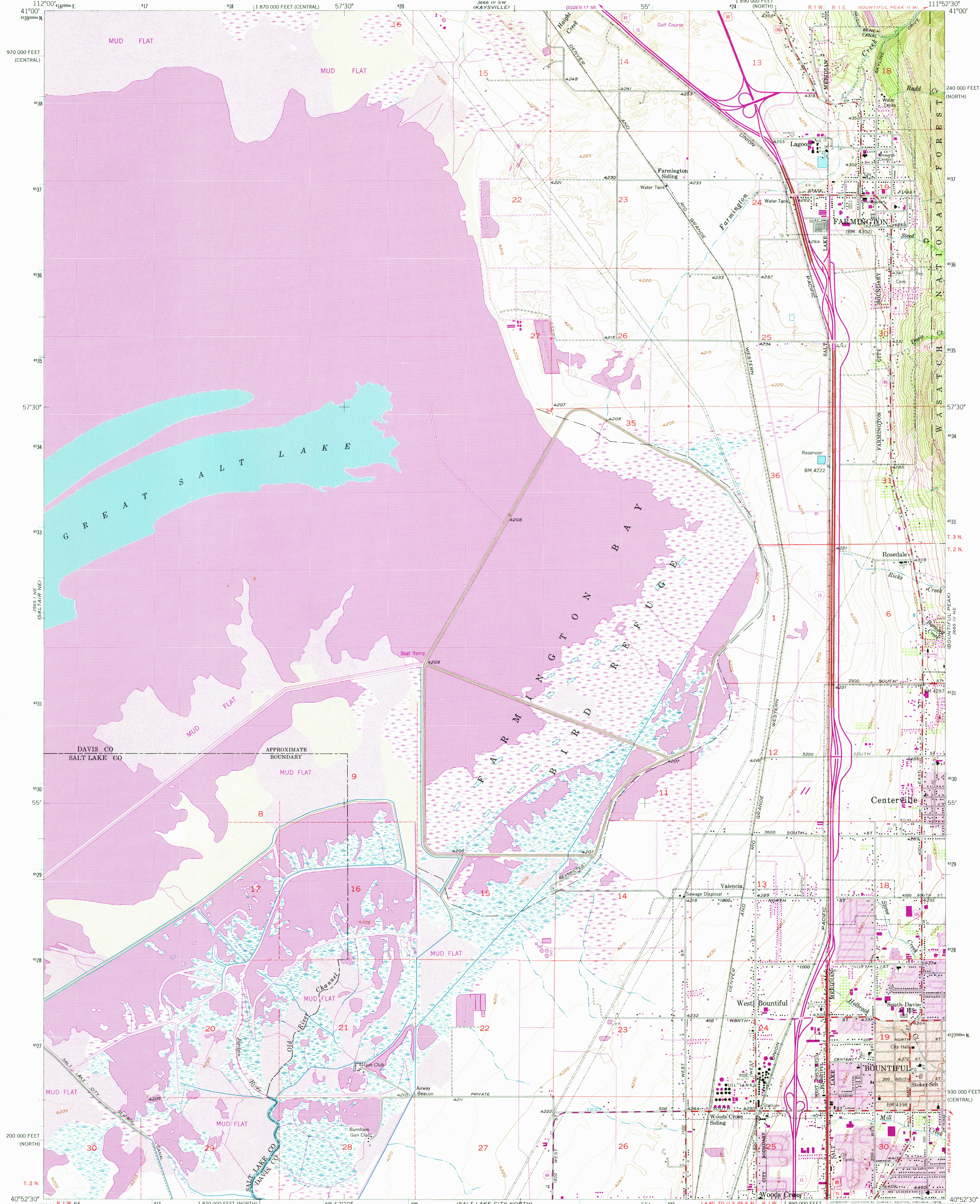

Dashed land lines indicate approximate locations

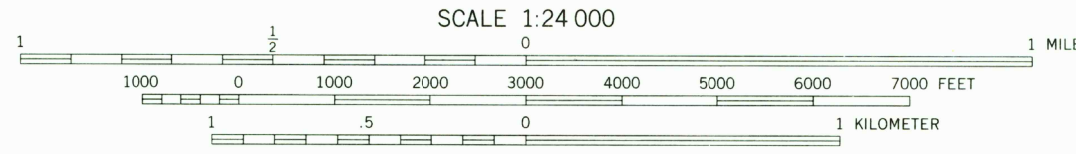
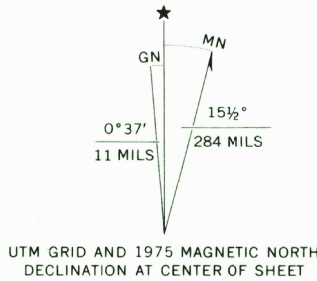
1000-meter Universal Transverse Mercator grid ticks,

Revisions shown in purple compiled from aerial photographs

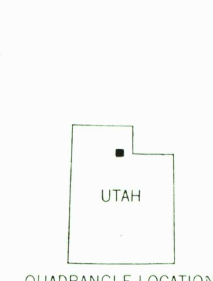
