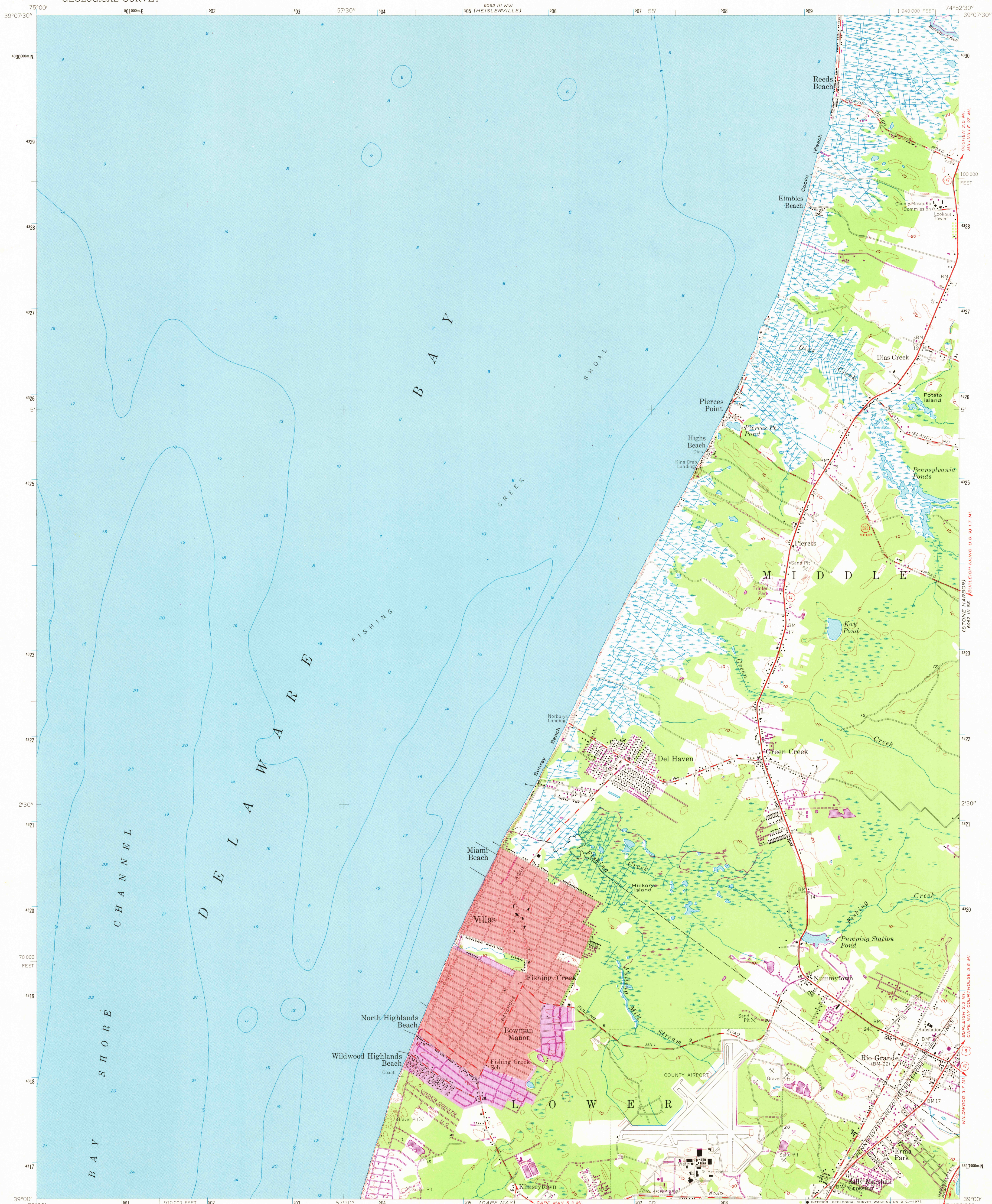

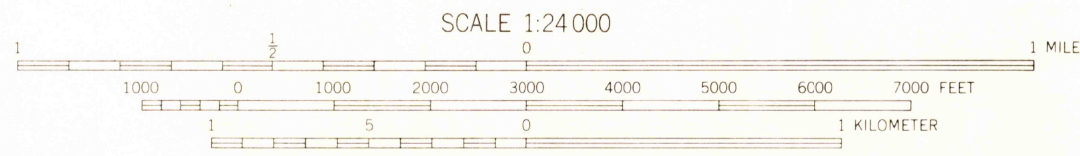
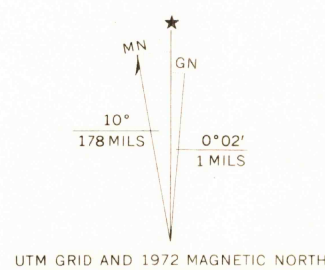
Polyconic projection, 1927 North American datum
