

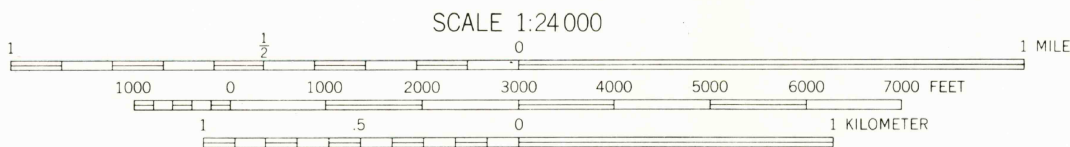
LITTLE RIVER

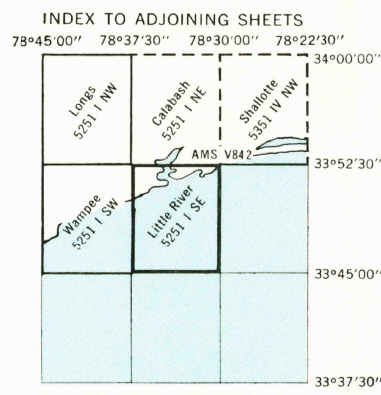
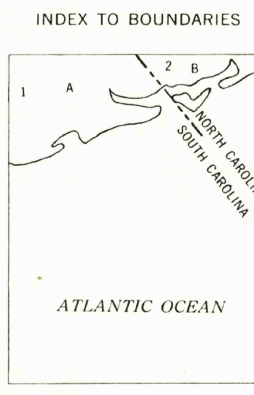
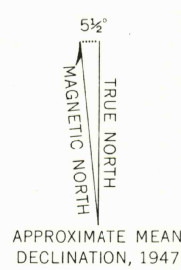
