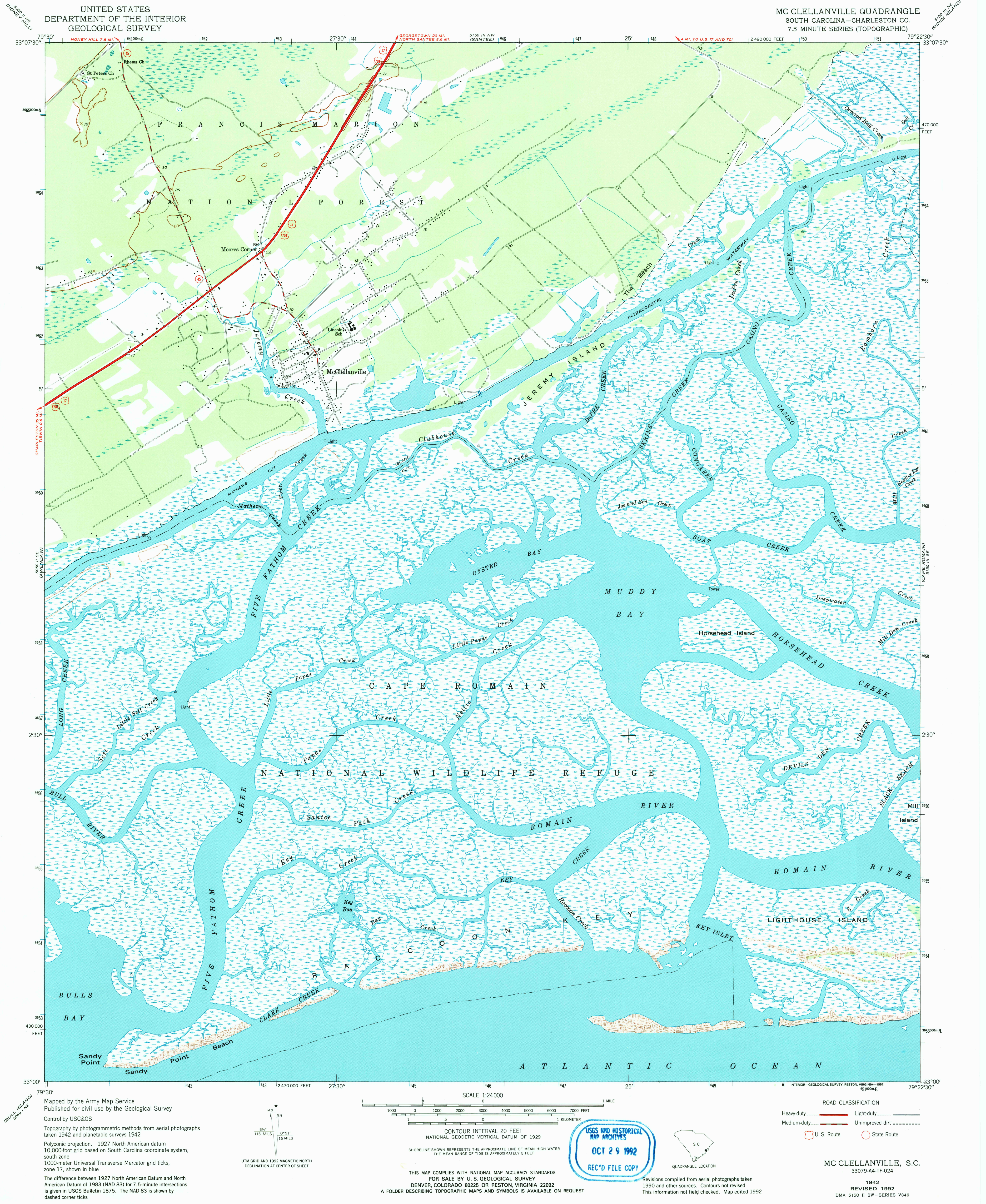

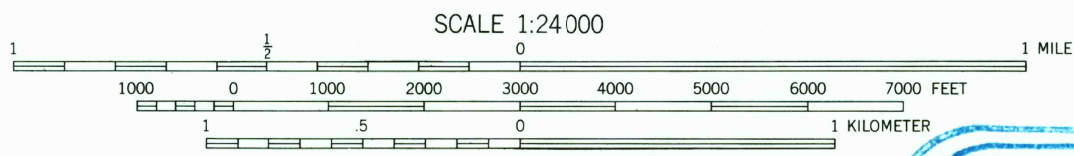
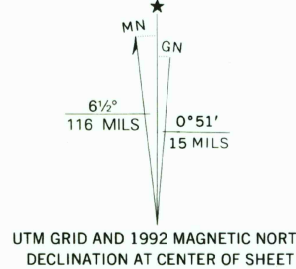

zone 17, shown in blue

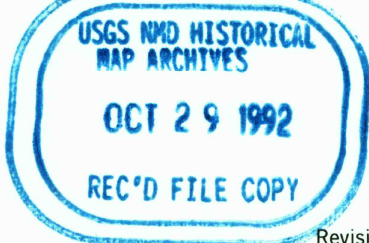
