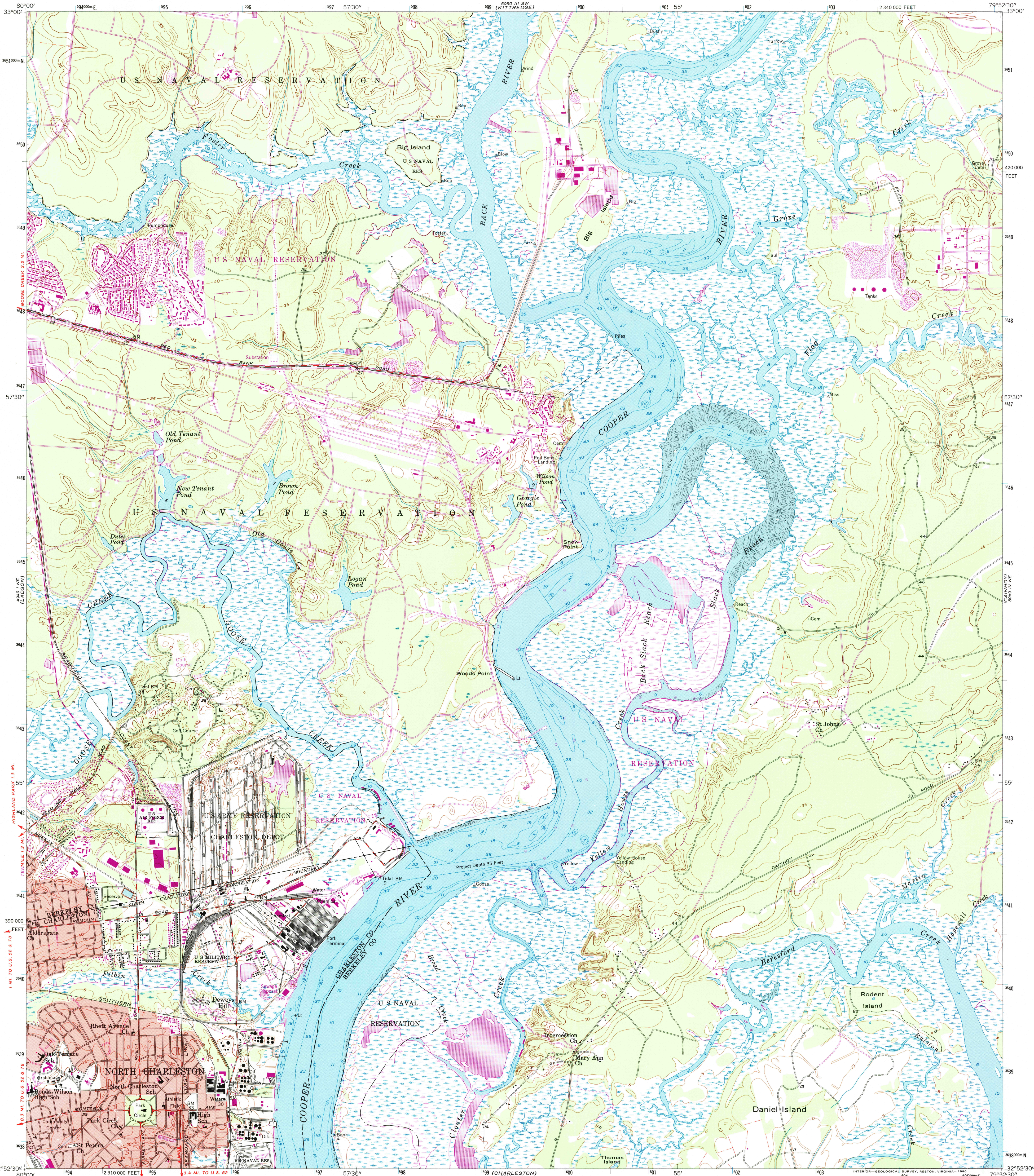

1000-meter Universal Transverse Mercator grid ticks, zone 17, shown in blue

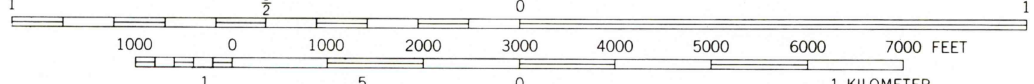
To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983

THE AVERAGE RANGE OF TIDE IS APPROXIMATELY 3.2 FEET

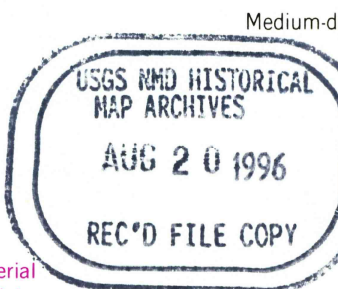
