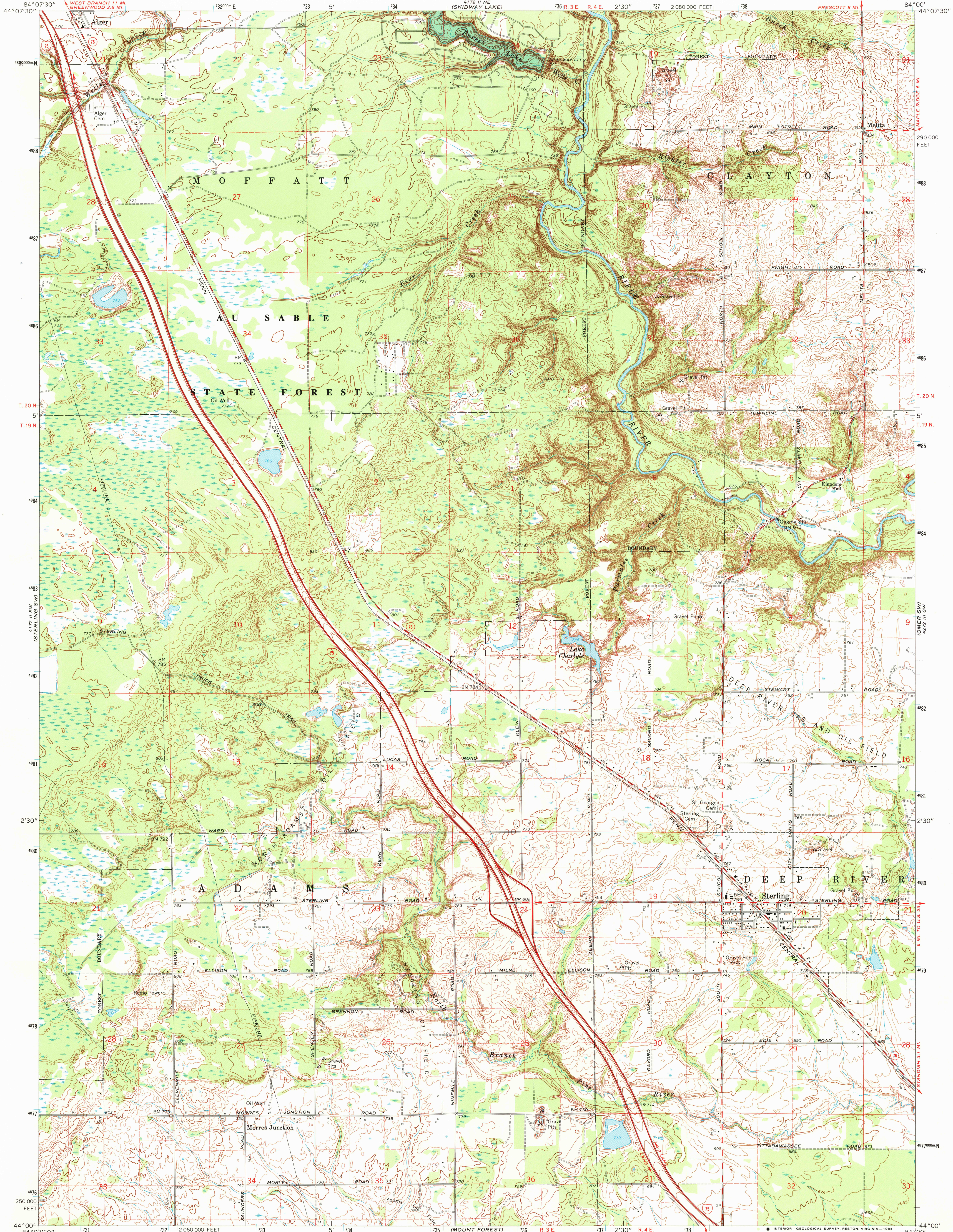

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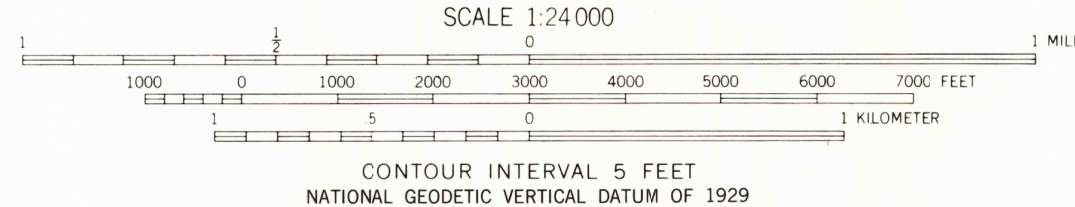
Topography by photogrammetric methods from aerial

10,000-foot grid based on Michigan coordinate system, central zone
1000-meter Universal Transverse Mercator grid ticks,
zone 16, shown in blue

To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983,
move the projection lines 1 meter north and
3 meters west as shown by dashed corner ticks

There may be private inholdings within the boundaries of
the National or State reservations shown on this map

Fine red dashed lines indicate selected fence and field lines where
generally visible on aerial photographs. This information is unchecked
