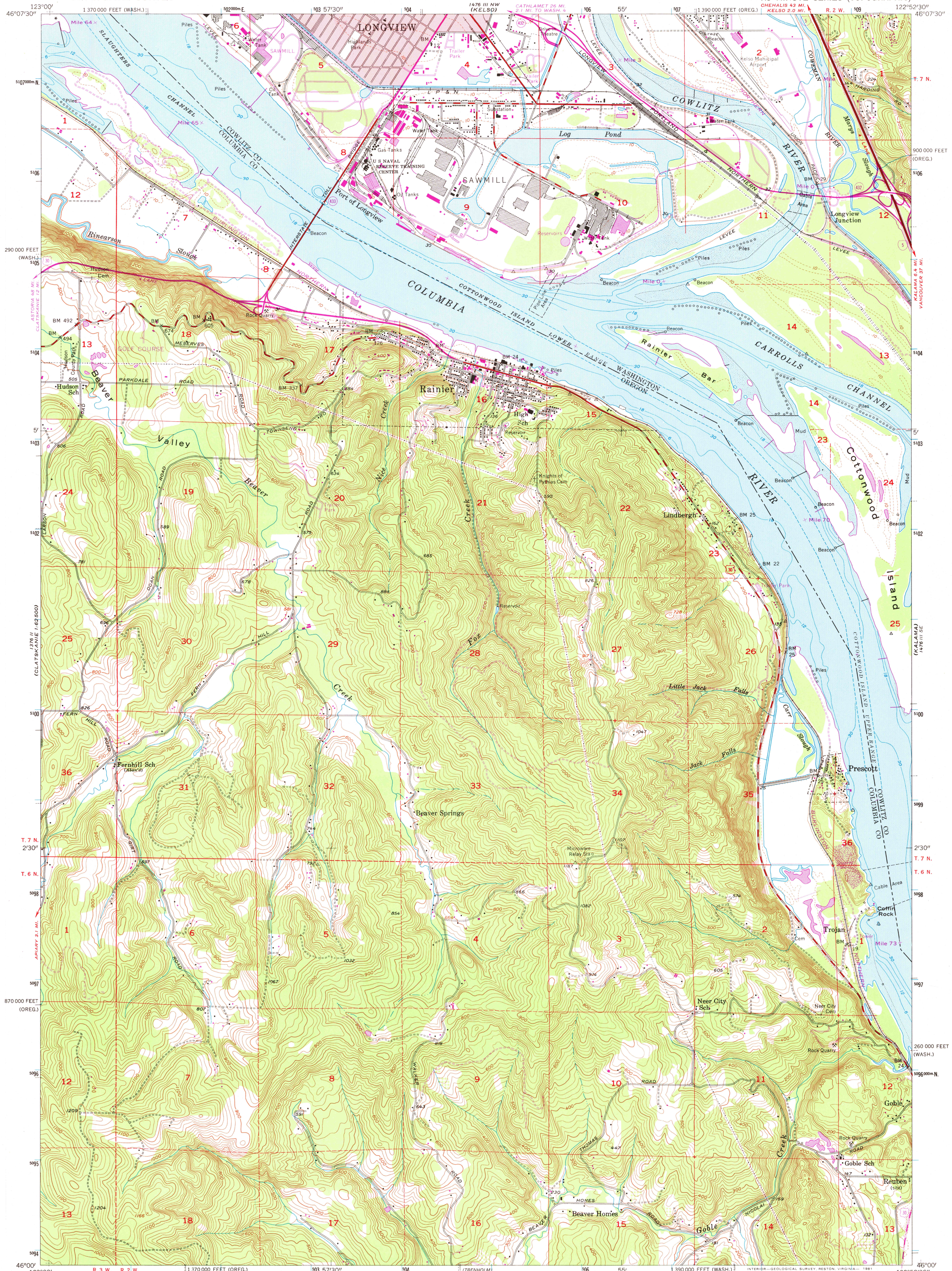

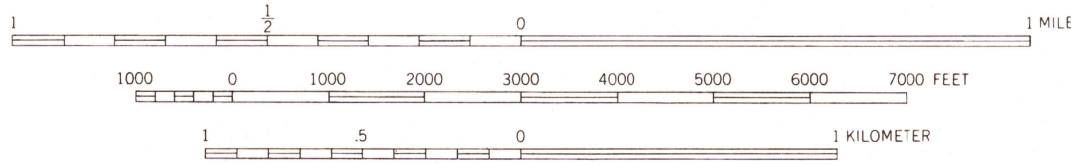
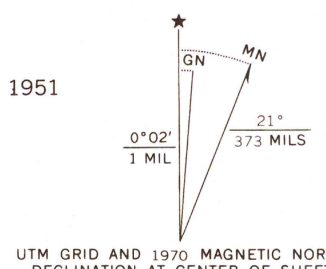

1000-meter Universal Transverse Mercator grid ticks,
zone 10, shown in blue
To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983
move the projection lines 23 meters north and
95 meters east as shown by dashed corner ticks
Red tint indicates areas in which only landmark buildings are shown
Dashed land lines indicate approximate locations
