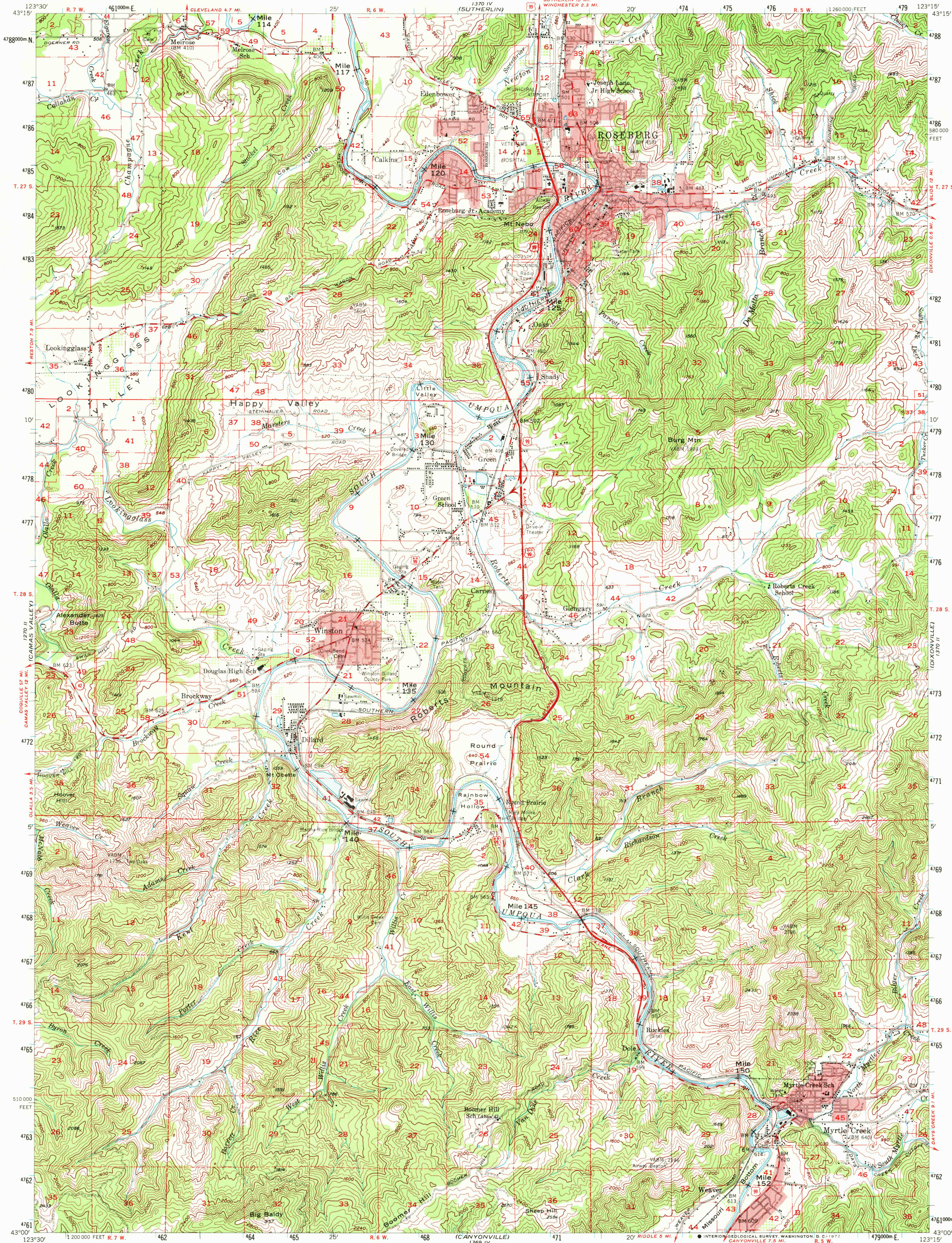

Polycyclic projection, 1927 North American datum

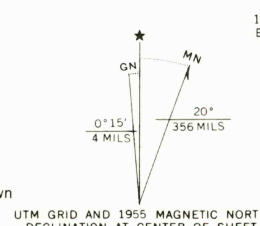
10,000-foot grid based on Oregon coordinate system, south zone
