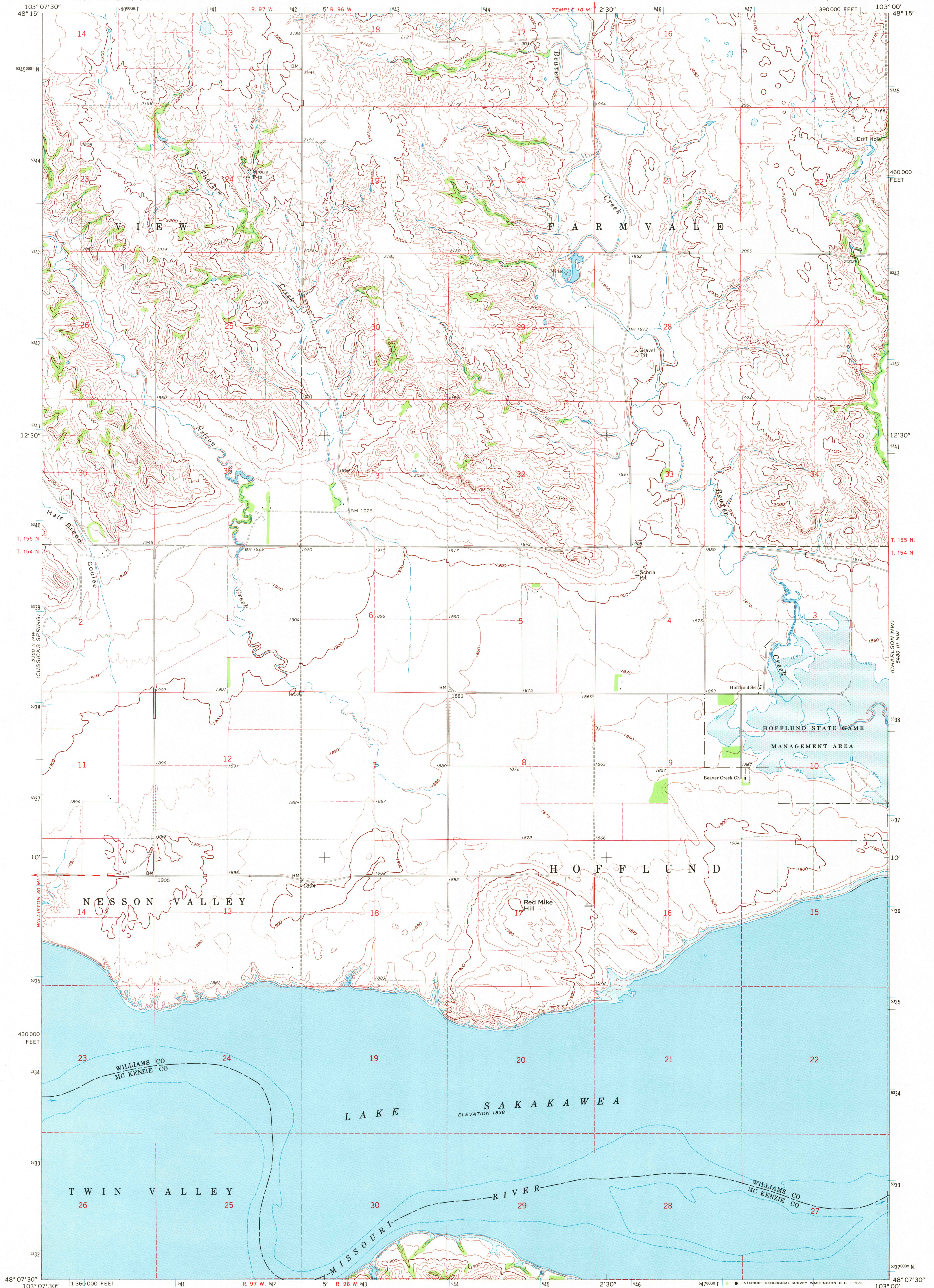
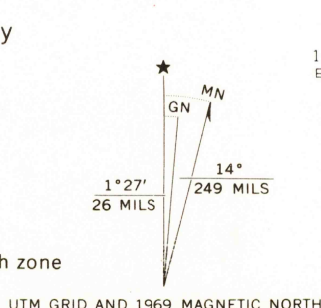

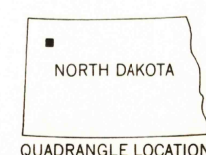
RED MIKE HILL QUADRANGLE
