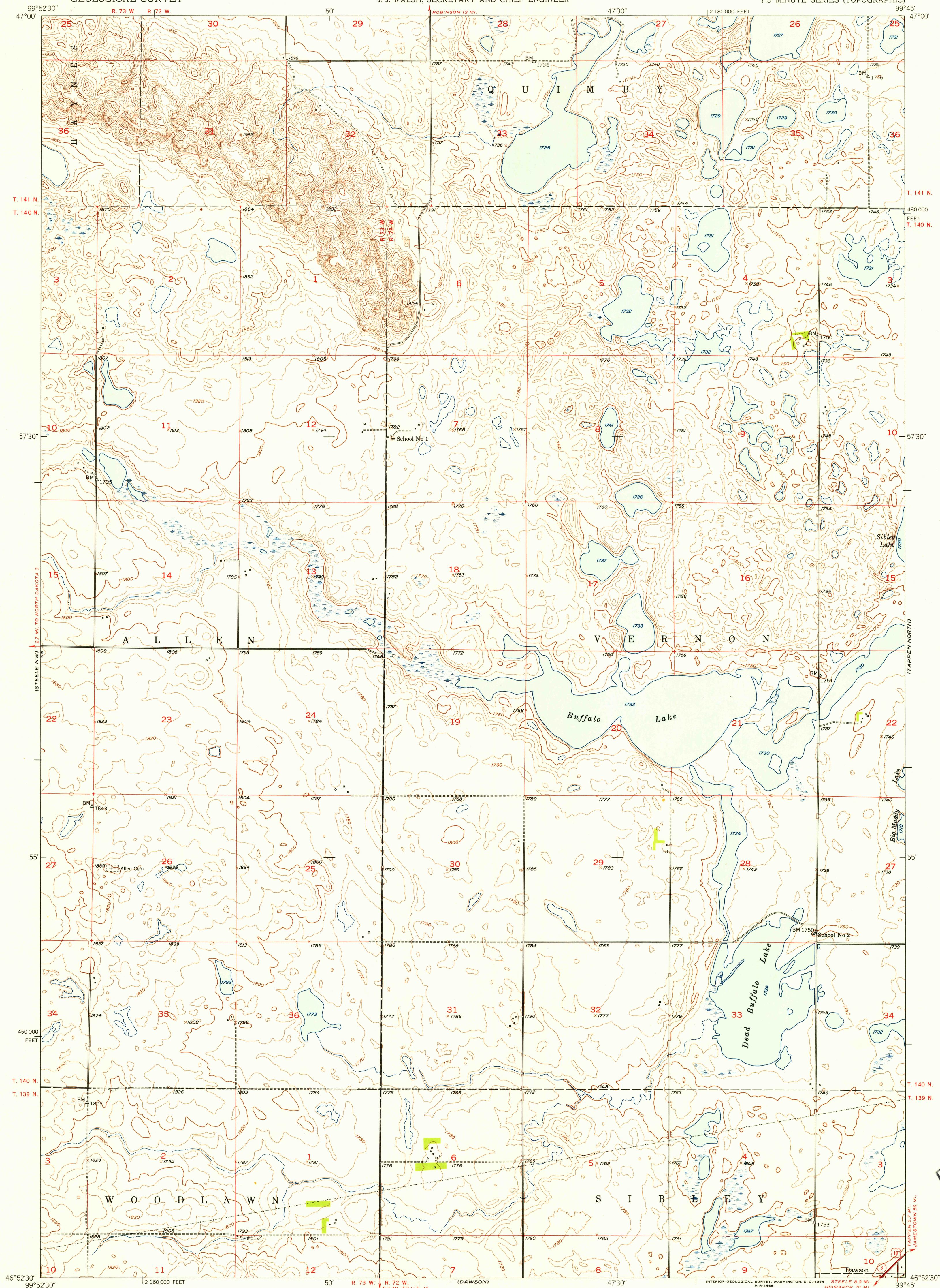

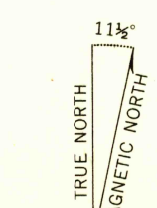

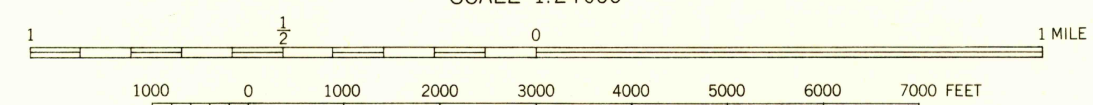

10,000-foot grid based on North Dakota coordinate system, south zone



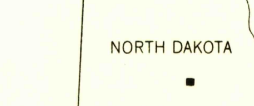
APPROXIMATE MEAN DECLINATION, 1952
