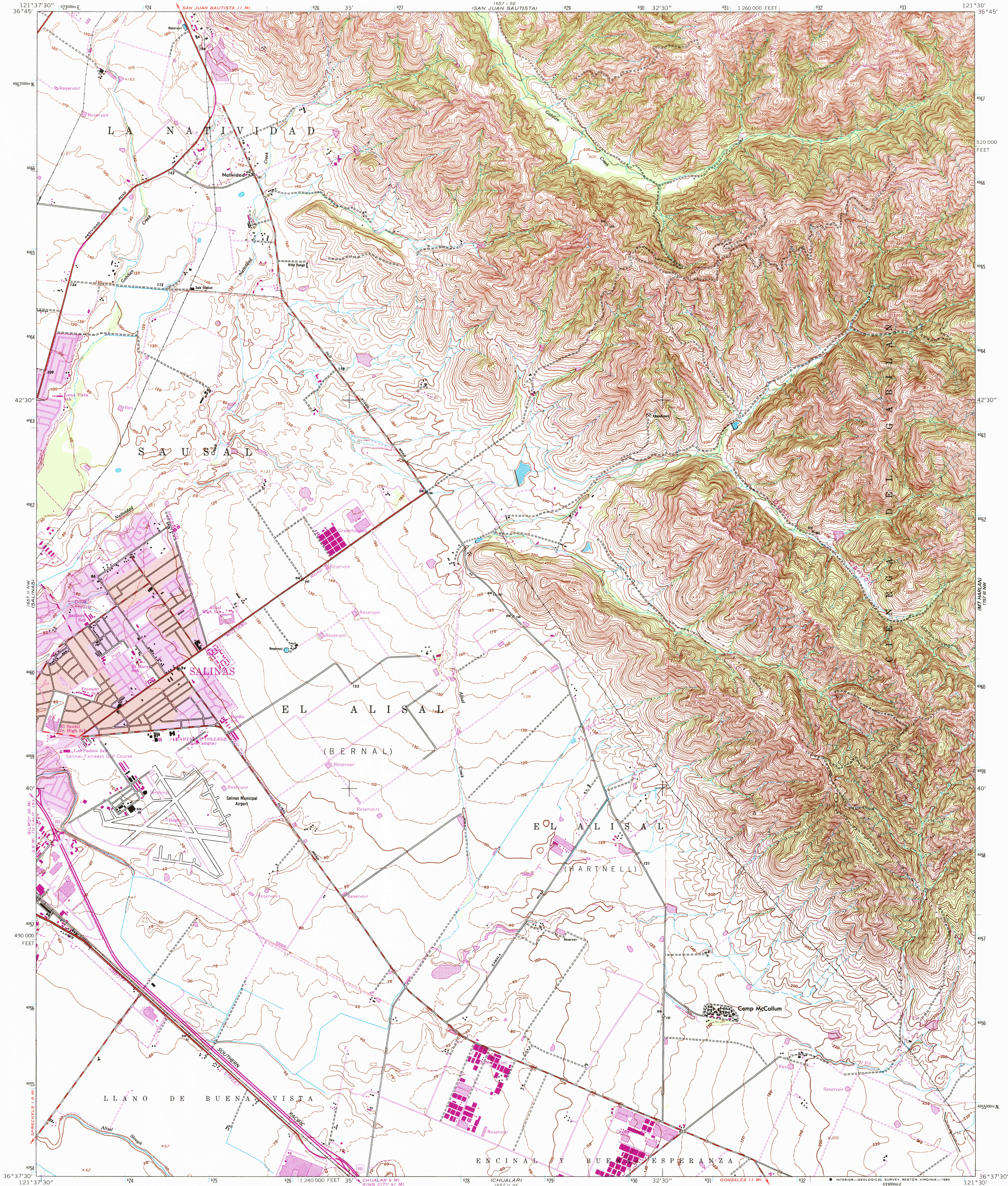

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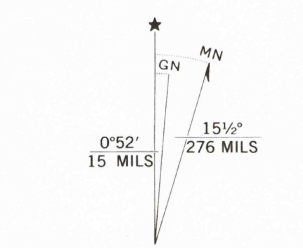

To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983,
move the projection lines 11 meters north and
93 meters east as shown by dashed corner ticks
