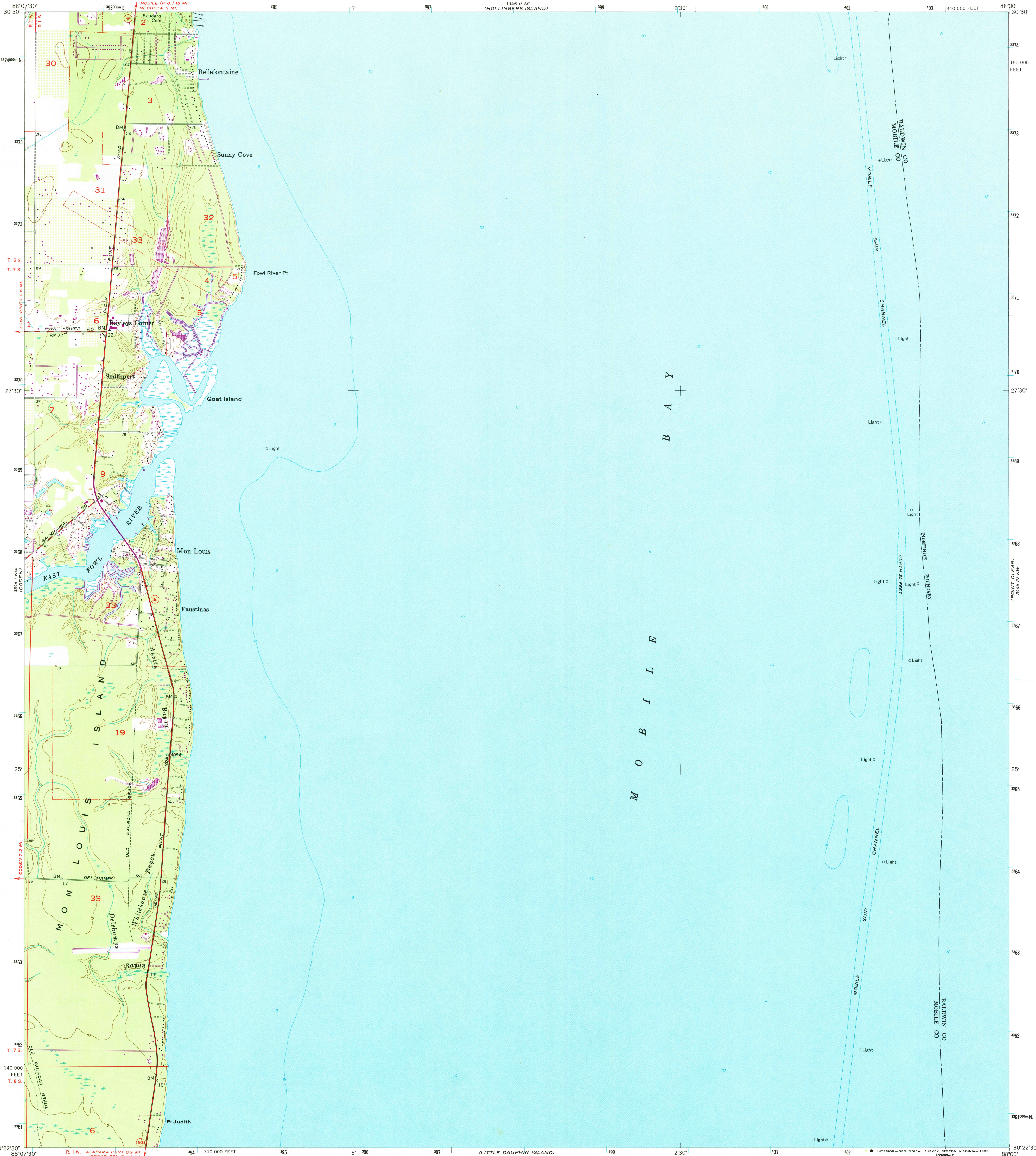

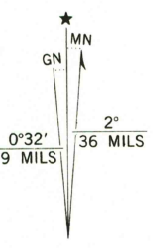

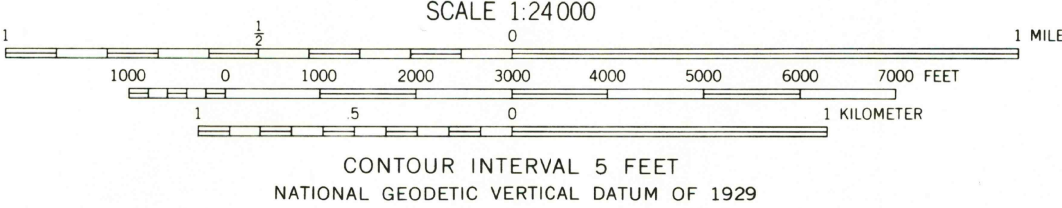

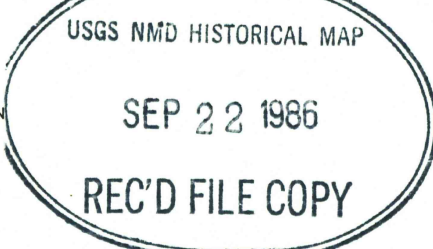
UTM GRID AND 1985 MAGNETIC NORTH DECLINATION AT CENTER OF SHEET
