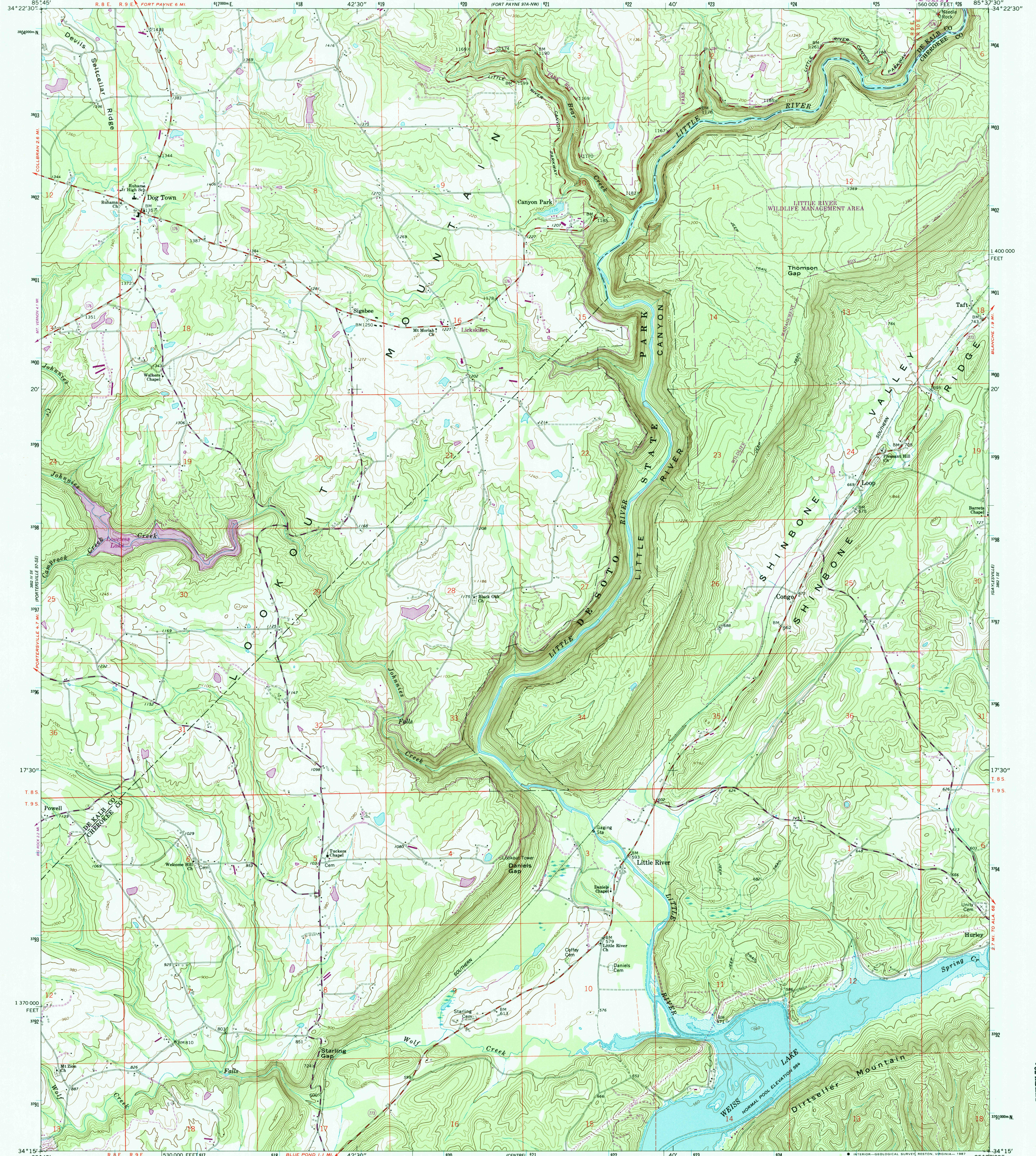

To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983 move the projection lines 8 meters south and 4 meters west as shown by dashed corner ticks
