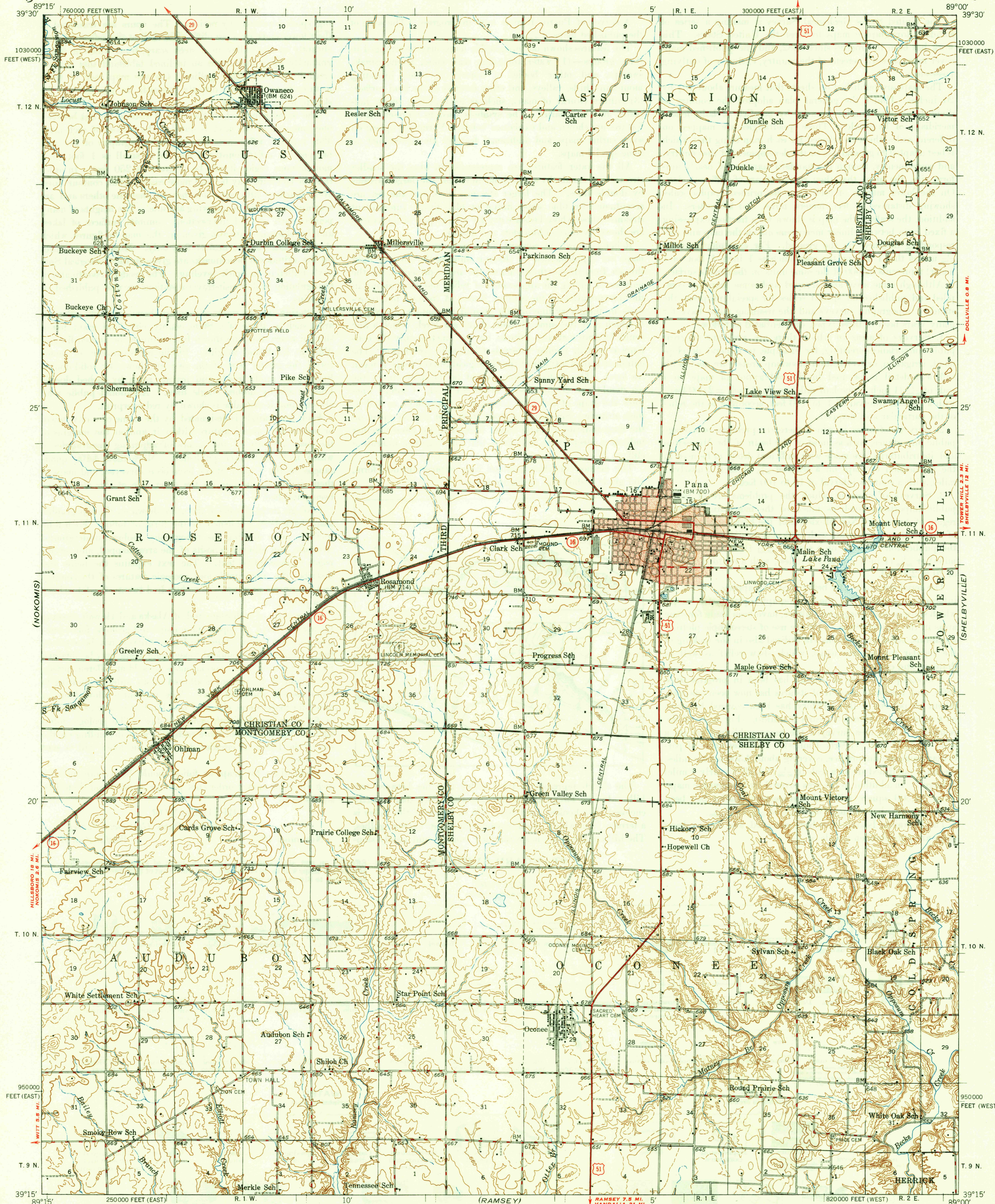

15 MINUTE SERIES (TOPOGRAPHIC)

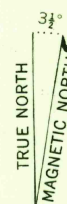

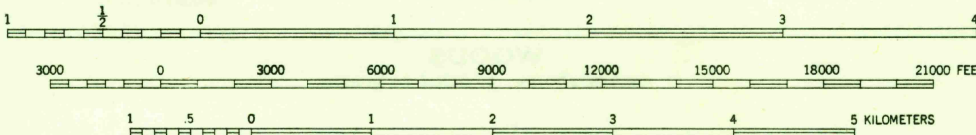
