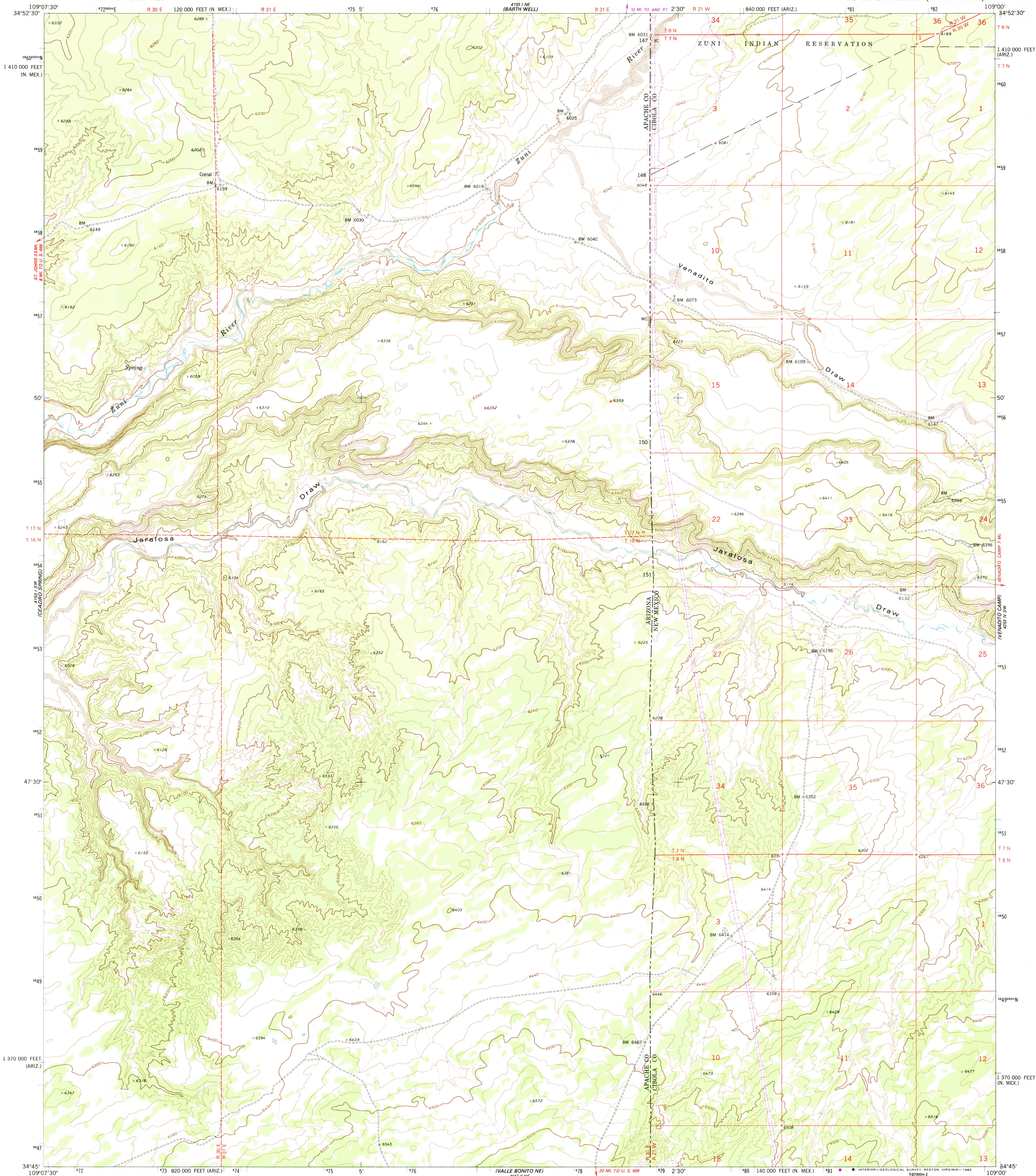

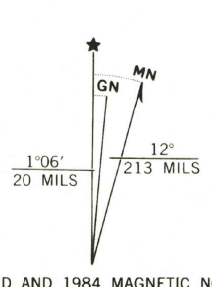
CEADRO SPRING SE QUADRANGLE

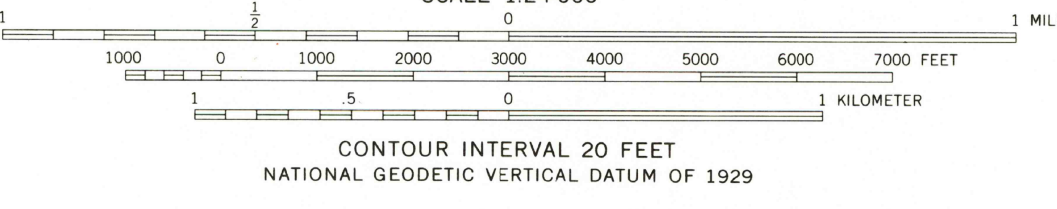

To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983
move the projection lines 58 meters east
as shown by dashed corner ticks
