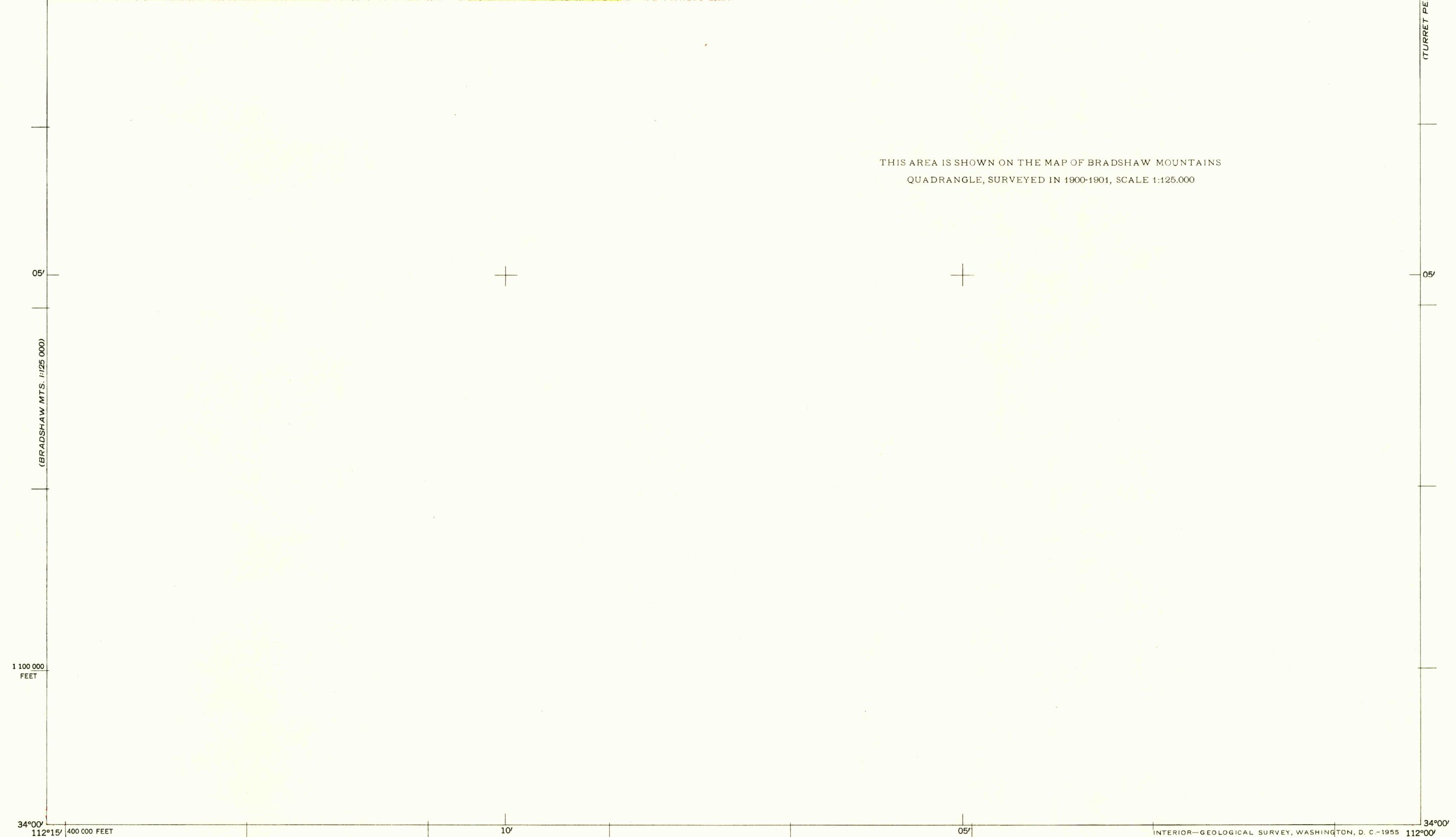




THIS AREA IS SHOWN ON THE MAP OF BRADSHAW MOUNTAINS
QUADRANGLE, SURVEYED IN 1900-1901, SCALE 1:125,000



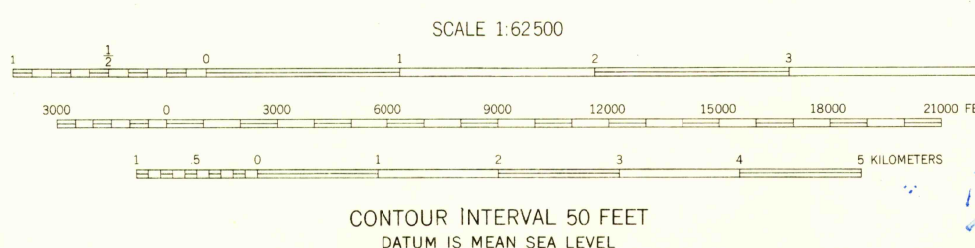
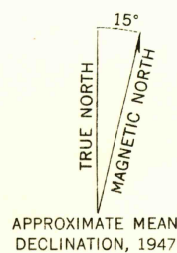
