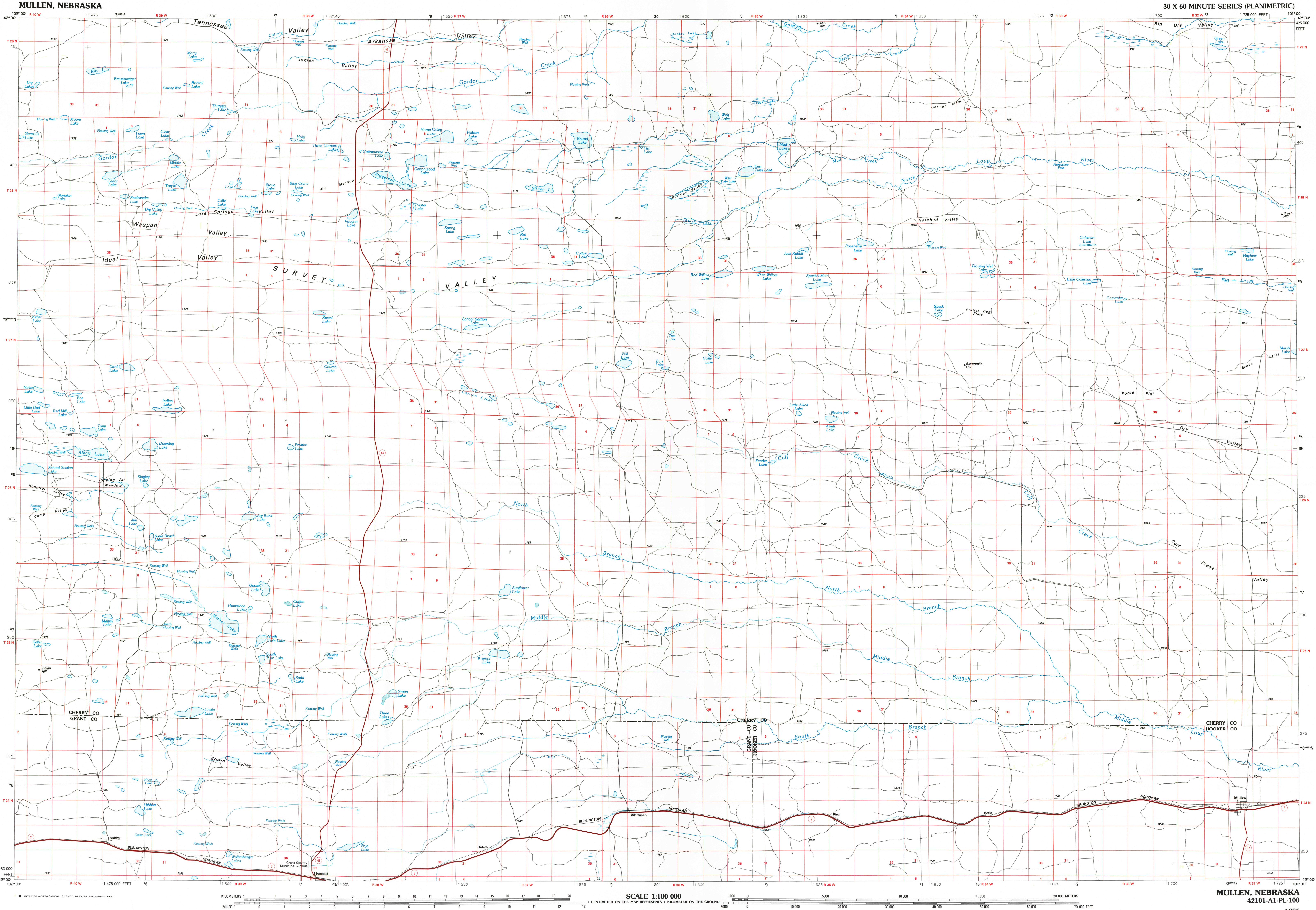
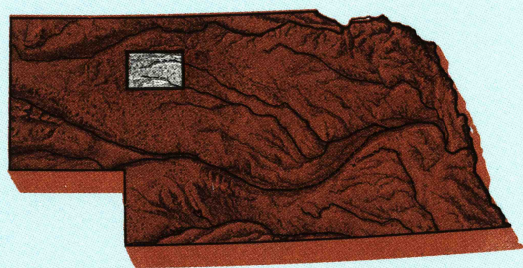




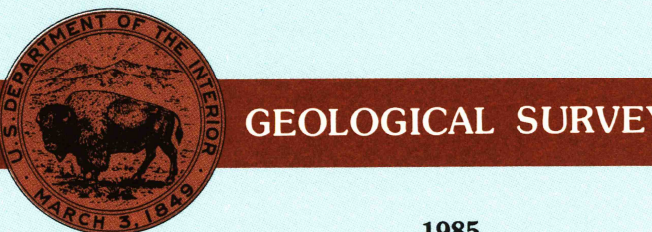

Topographic Map Symbols

- Primary highway, hard surface. Secondary highway, hard surface. Light duty road, principal street, hard or improved surface. Other road or street, trail. Route marker: Interstate, U.S., State. Railroad: standard gage, narrow gage. Bridge: overpass, underpass. Tunnel: road, railroad. Built up area: building, elevation. Airport: landing field, landing strip. National boundary. State boundary. County boundary. National or State reservation boundary. Land grant boundary. U.S. public lands survey: range, township, section. Range, township, section line: protracted. Power transmission line: pipeline. Dam: dam with lock. Cemetery: building. Well: water well, spring. Mine shaft, adit or cave, mine, quarry, gravel pit. Campground: picnic area; U.S. location monument. Ruins: cliff dwelling. Distorted surface: strip mine, lava, sand. Contours: index, intermediate, supplementary.
