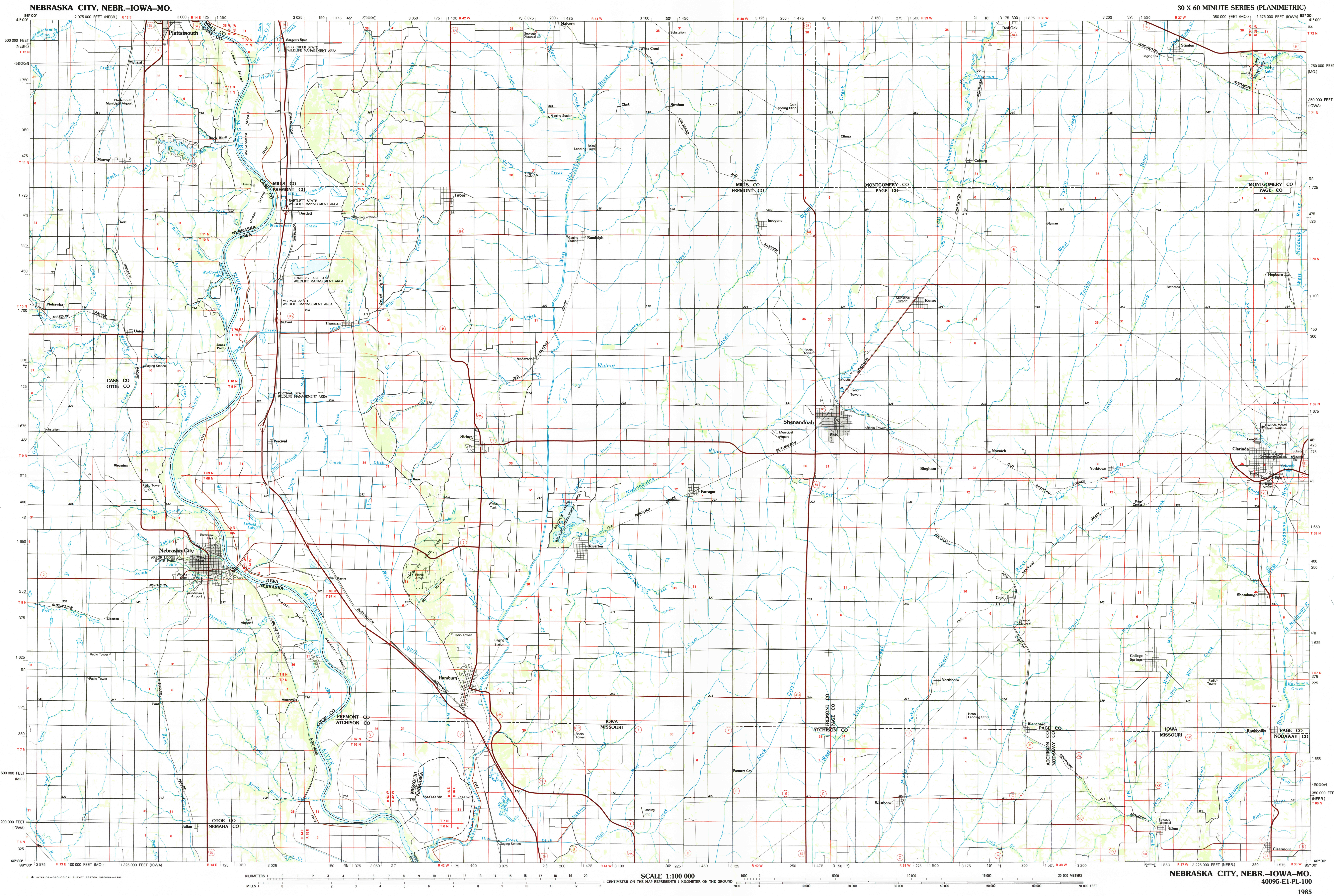
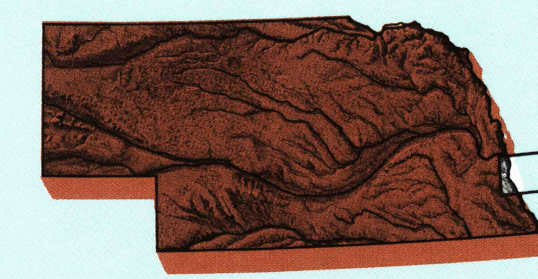

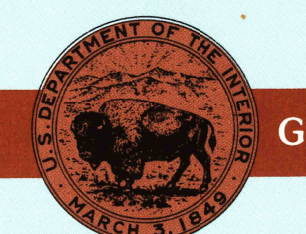

There may be private inholdings within the boundaries of the National or State reservations shown on this map

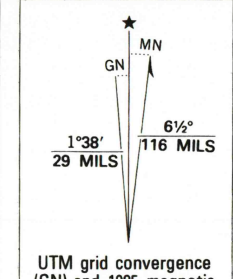
NATIONAL GEODETIC VERTICAL DATUM OF 1929
