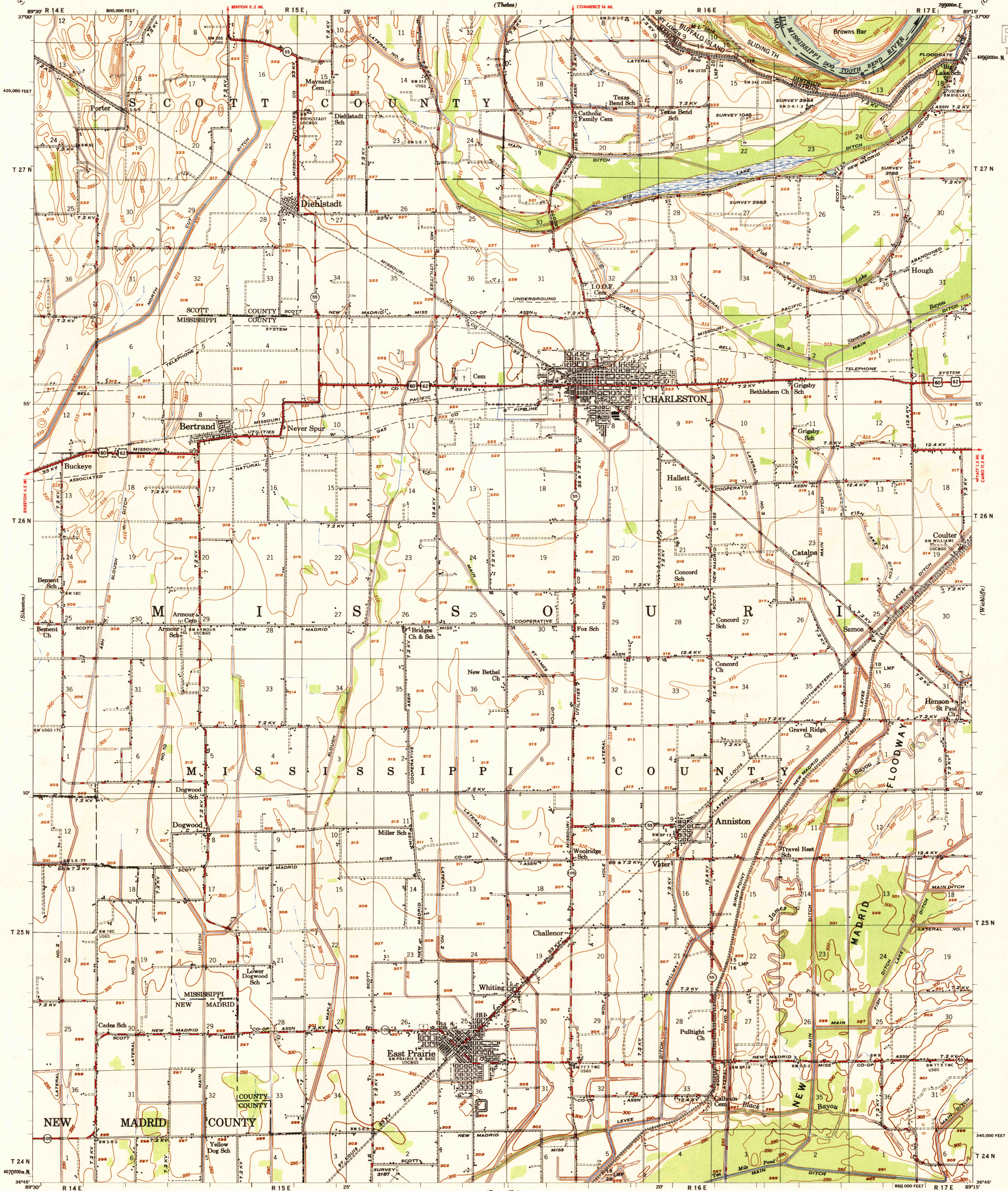




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Aerial Photography, 1952. Planimetry and Topography Field checked 1953.
