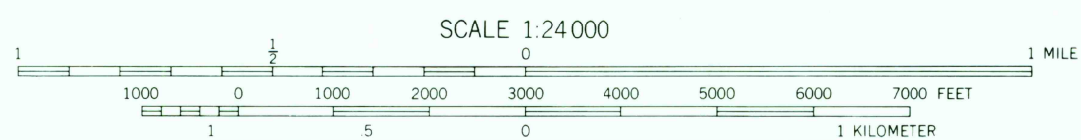
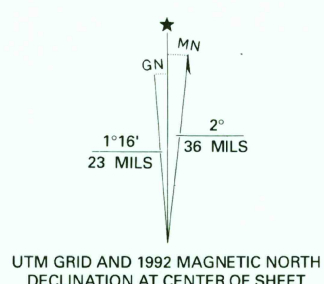
Orthophotomap prepared from high-altitude aerial photographs taken October 24, 1971. Topography by planetable surveys 1973
