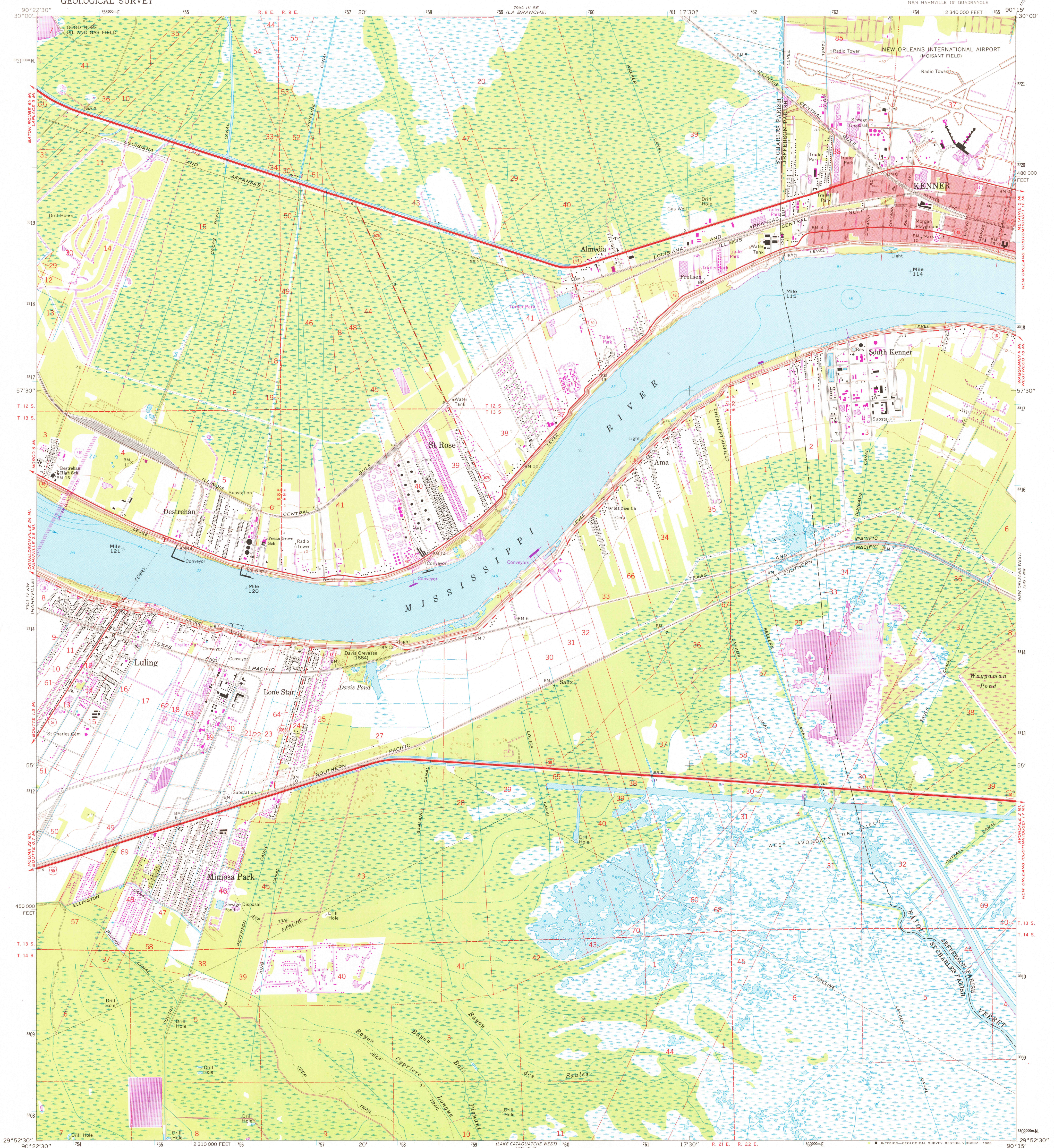

Polyconic projection. 1927 North American datum. 10,000-foot grid based on Louisiana coordinate system, south zone. 1000-meter Universal Transverse Mercator grid ticks, zone 15, shown in blue.

To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983, move the projection lines 19 meters south and 8 meters east as shown by dashed corner ticks.

Red tint indicates areas in which only landmark buildings are shown.

All or part of this quadrangle lies within a subsidence area where omitted, land lines have not been established.
