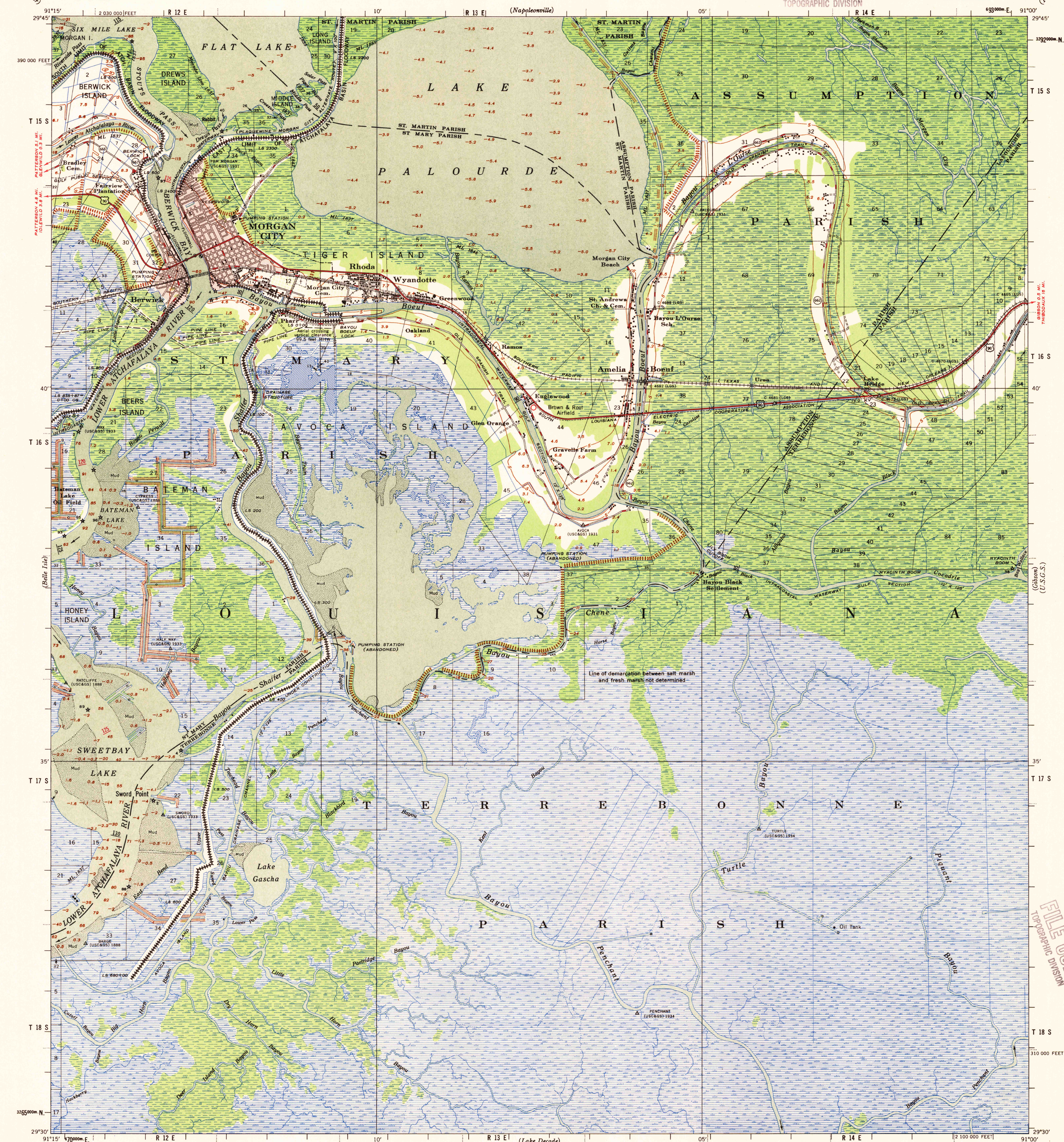




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Polyconic Projection, 1927 North American Datum.

Aerial photography, October 1947, November 1951, September 1952, October-December 1953. Field checked 1954.

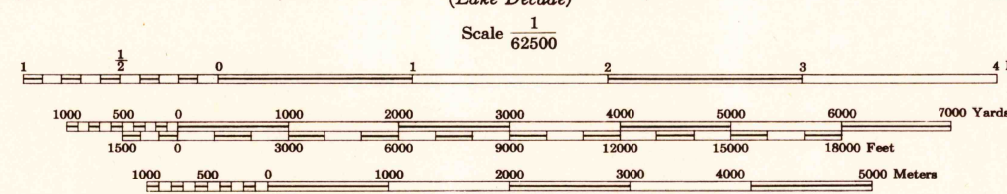
Depths in Lower Atchafalaya River below Morgan City, Louisiana and Sweetbay Lake surveyed April-May 1953 are expressed in feet and refer to mean low water.

Elevations shown in Six Mile Lake, Stouts Pass, Bayou Penchant and Bayou Chene as of survey July-September 1950; Lower Atchafalaya River (vicinity Berwick Lock) surveyed January 1952; Lower Atchafalaya River, Sweetbay Lake and Bayou Shaffer surveyed April-May 1953; Berwick Bay surveyed March 1946; Flat Lake surveyed October 1951; Lake Palourde surveyed November 1929 are expressed in feet and refer to mean sea level.

Dashed land lines are projected.

Political boundaries are shown according to best available information.

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Distances on Atchafalaya River below head, and through Six Mile Lake, Stouts Pass, Berwick Bay and Lower Atchafalaya River are shown (in red and black) at 5 mile intervals. Distances in black are based on the 1916-17 survey; distances in red are based on the 1950 survey.

Distances on Intracoastal Waterway from Harvey Lock at New Orleans, Louisiana, are shown at 5 mile intervals.

Distances on Intracoastal Waterway (Plaquemine Morgan City Alternate Route) from Plaquemine, Louisiana to Morgan City, Louisiana are shown at 5 mile intervals.

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
