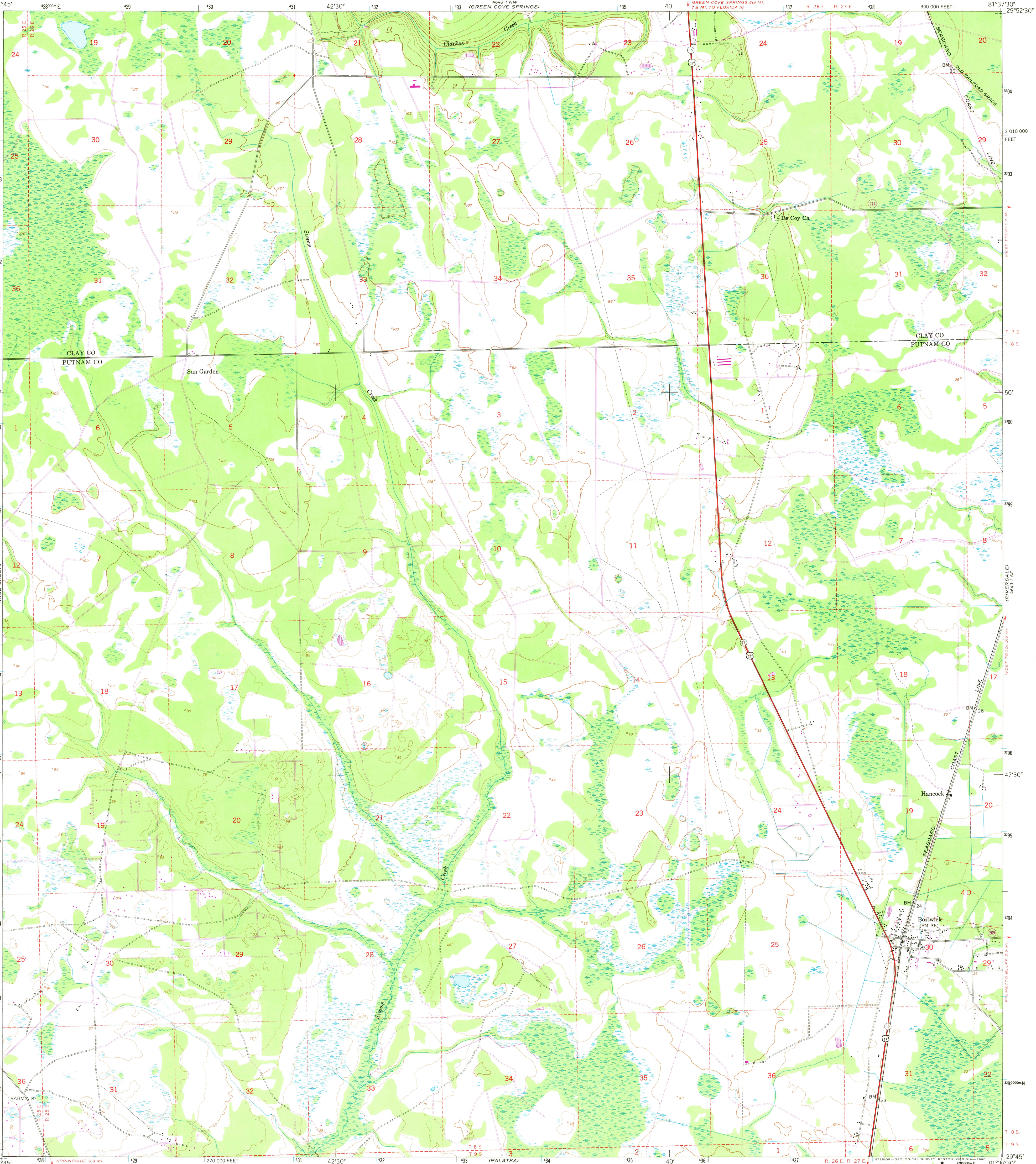

No distinction is made between barns, dwellings
commercial and industrial buildings
