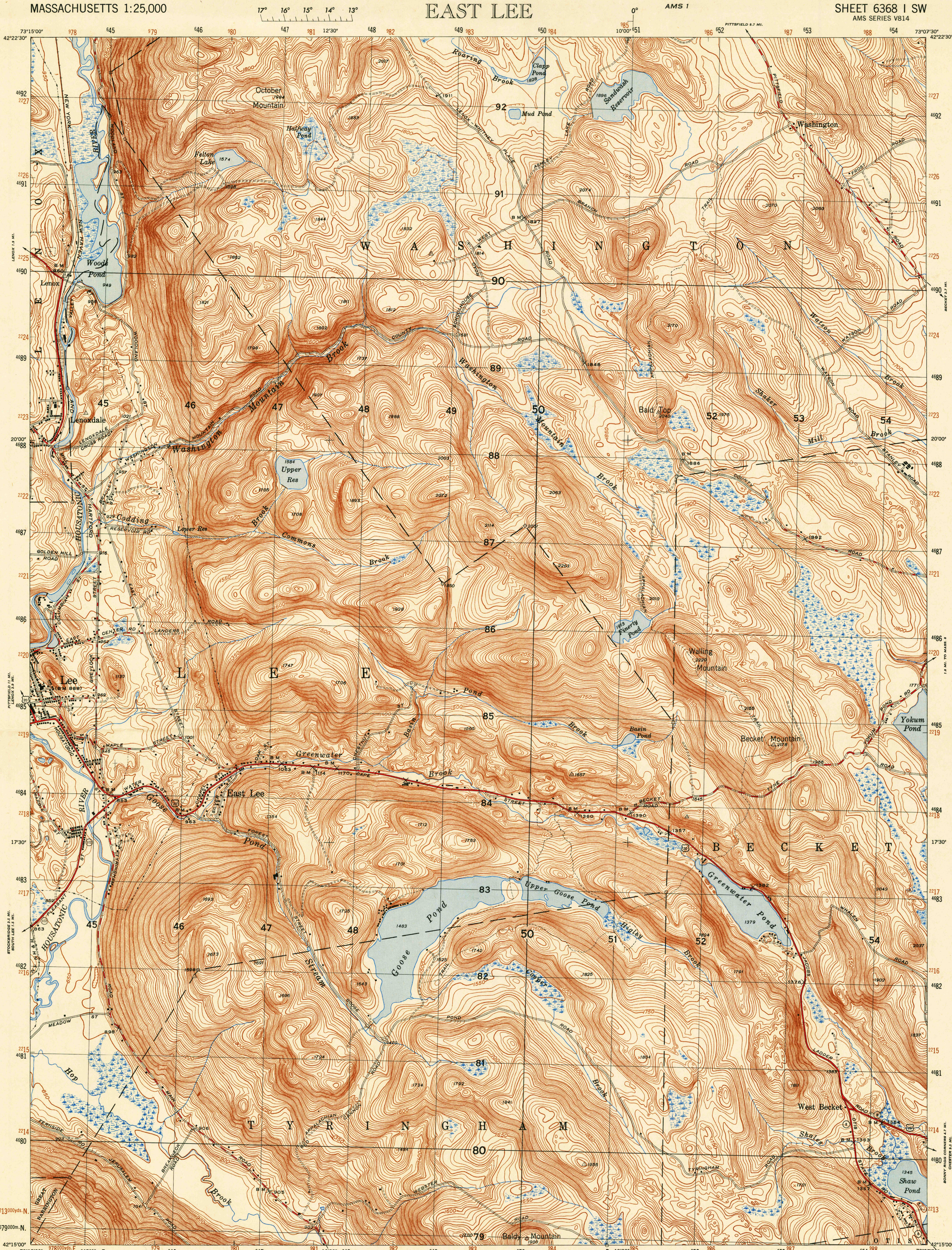
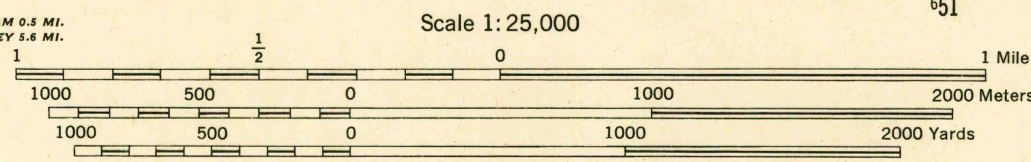

SAMPLE POINT - CENTER	
1. Locate first VERTICAL grid line to LEFT of point and read LARGE figures labeling the line either in the top or bottom margin, or on the line itself.	48
2. Estimate tenths from grid line to point.	2
3. Locate first HORIZONTAL grid line BELOW point and read LARGE figures labeling the line either in the left or right margin, or on the line itself.	91
4. Estimate tenths from grid line to point.	1
