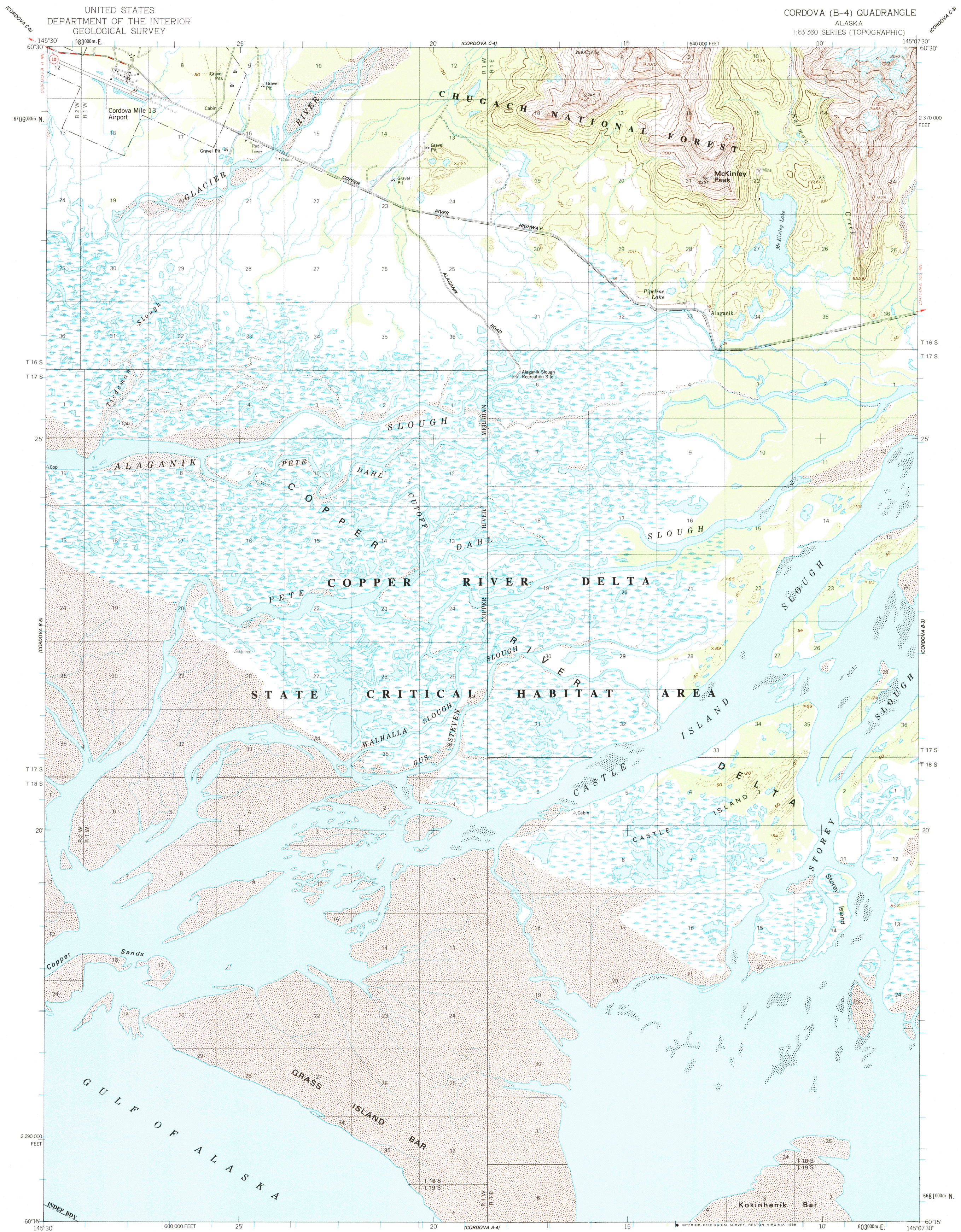

system, zone 3. 1927 North American Datum

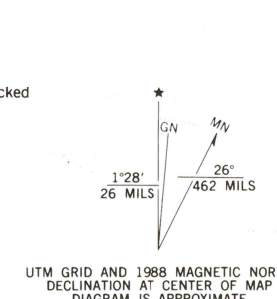
To place on the predicted North American Datum 1983 move

Folios CR-5, CR-6 and CR-10, Copper River Meridian

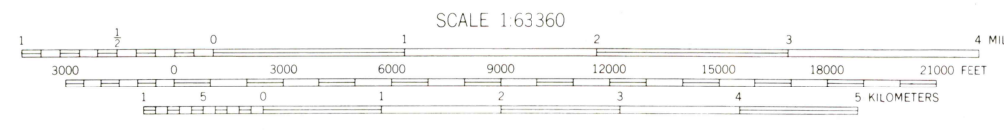
Swamps, as portrayed, indicate only the wetter areas,

the National or State reservations shown on this map

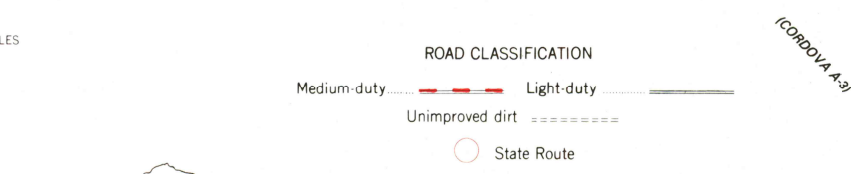


The Alaska Maritime National Wildlife Refuge consists of
