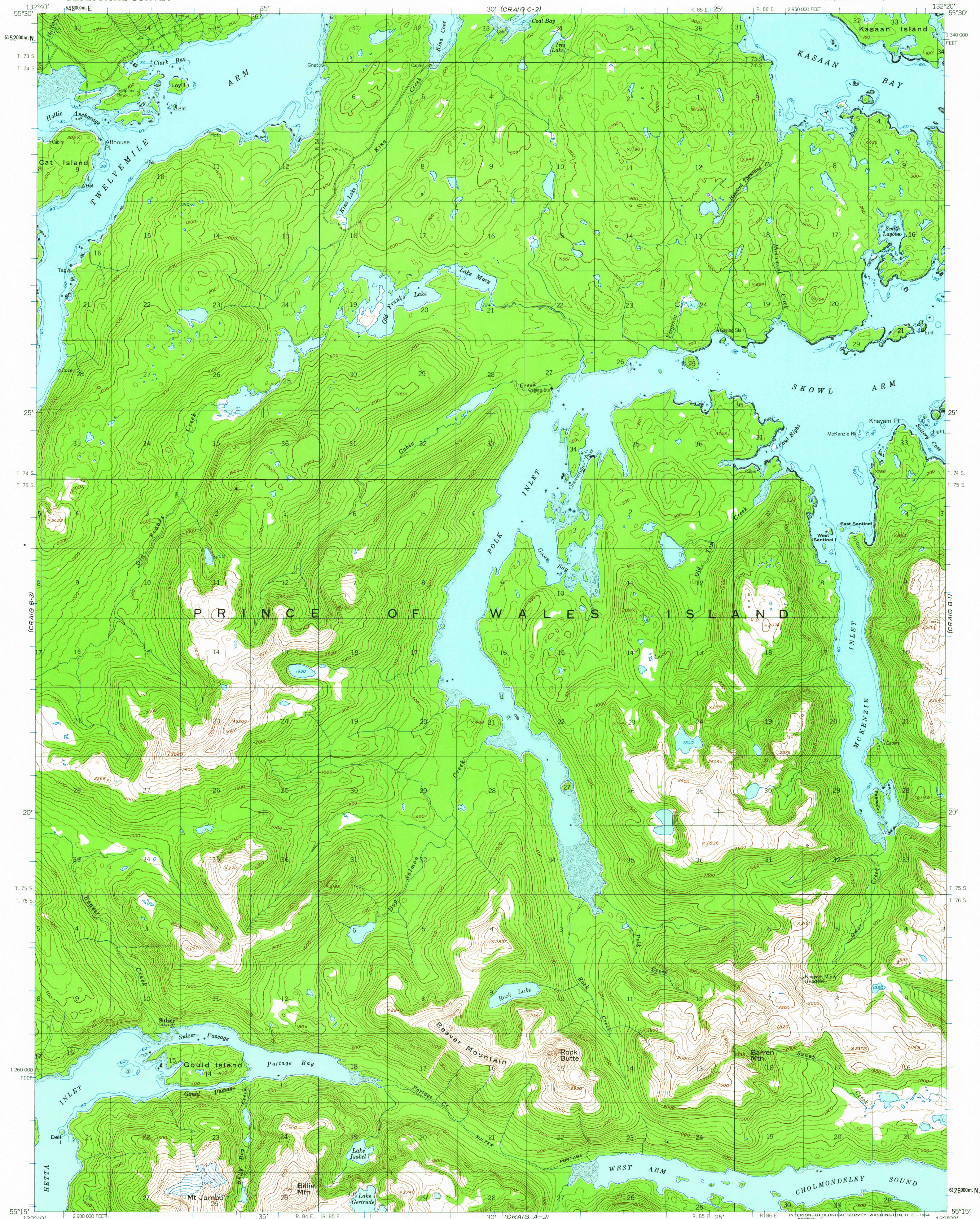

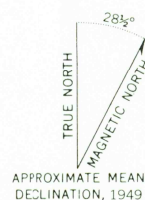

Swamps, as portrayed, indicate only the wetter areas, usually of low relief, as interpreted from aerial photographs Entire land area is within the Tongass National Forest
