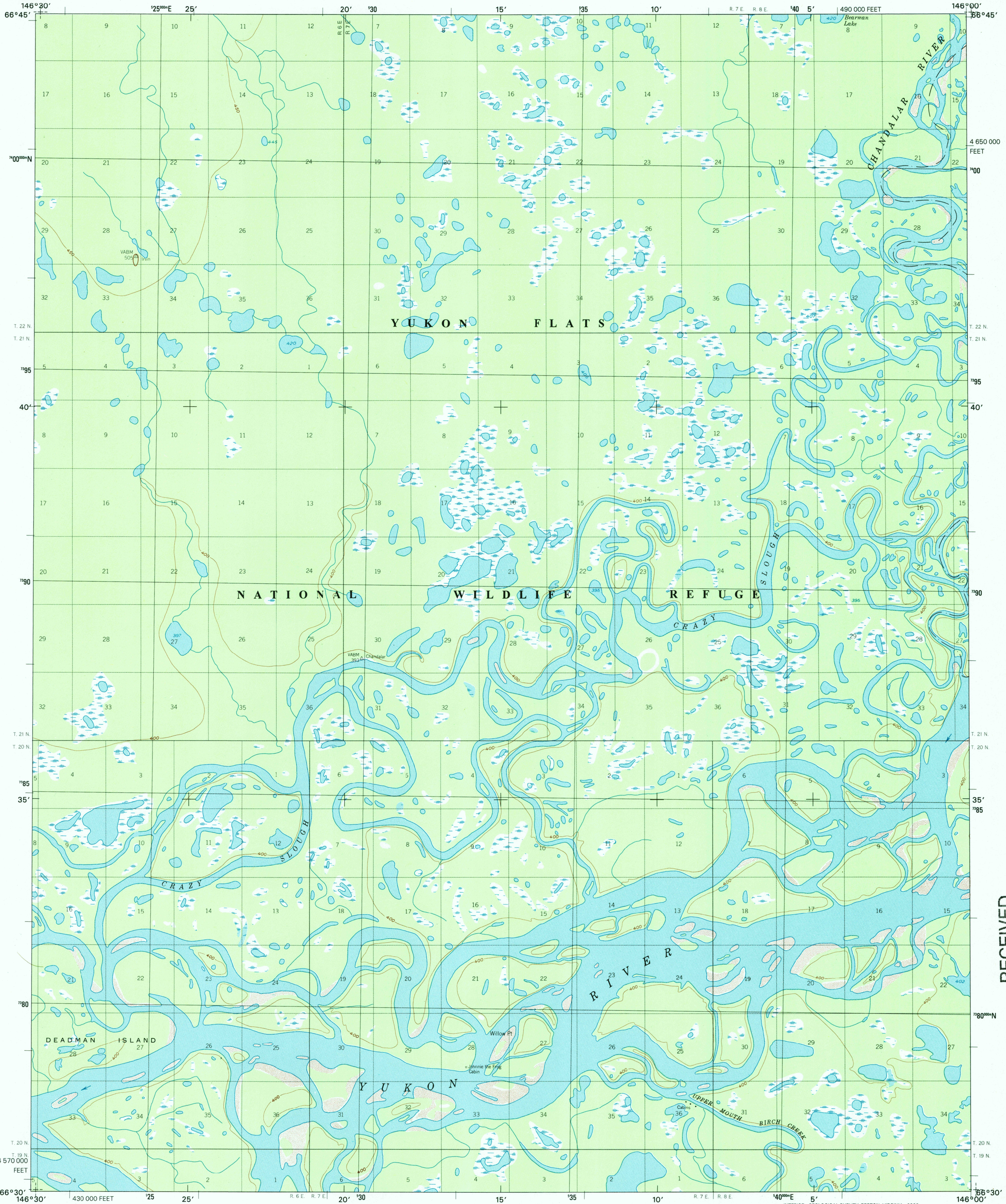

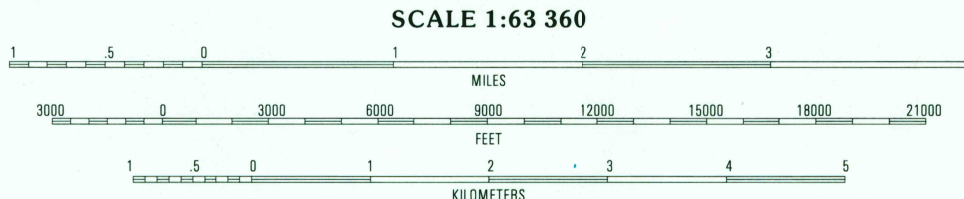
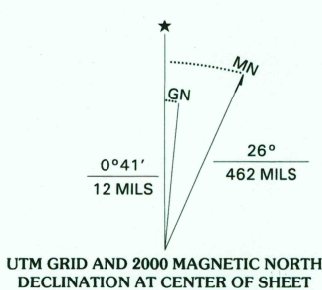
North American Datum 1927 (NAD 27). Projection and 5 000-meter grid: Universal Transverse Mercator, zone 6
