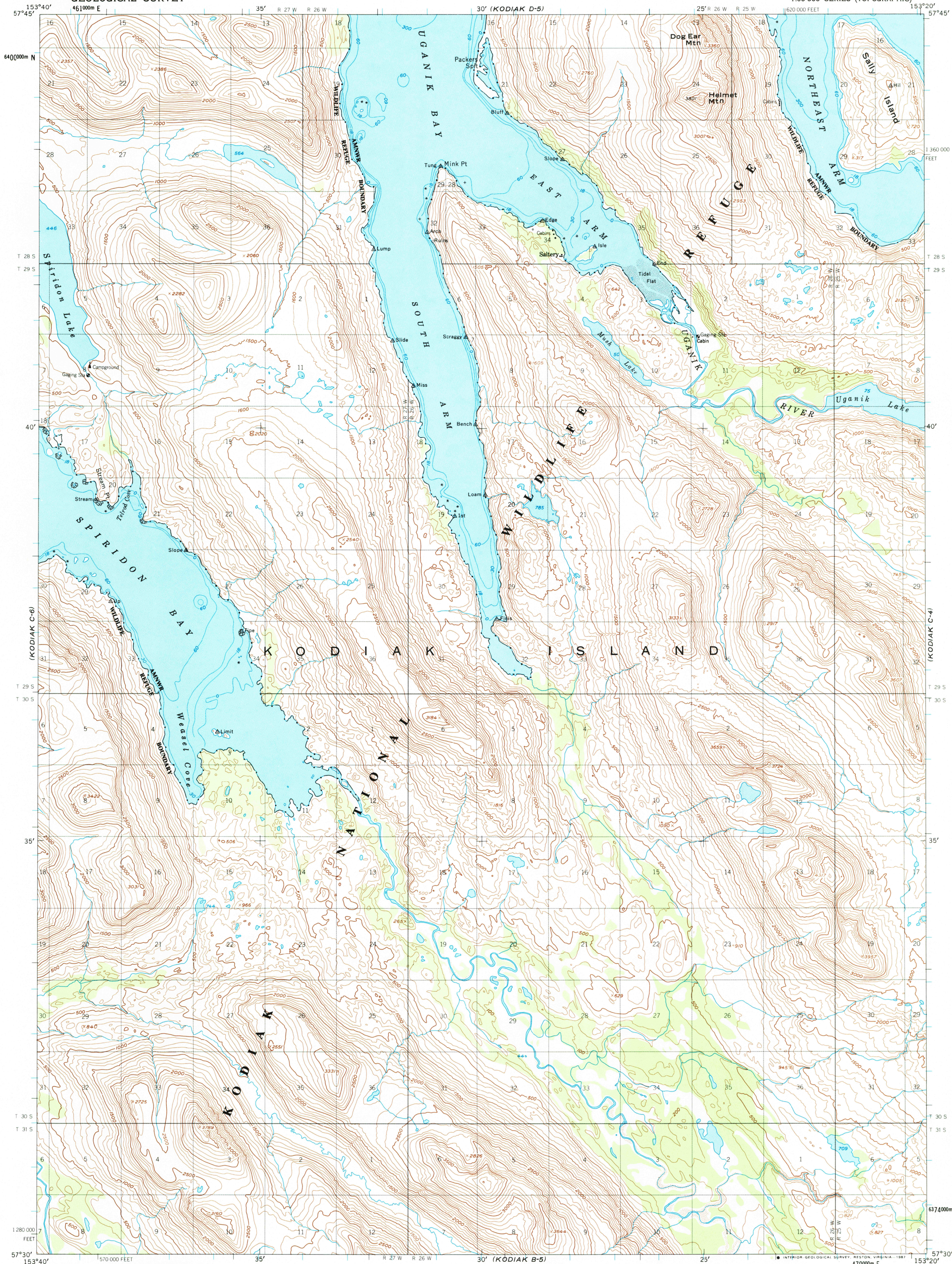

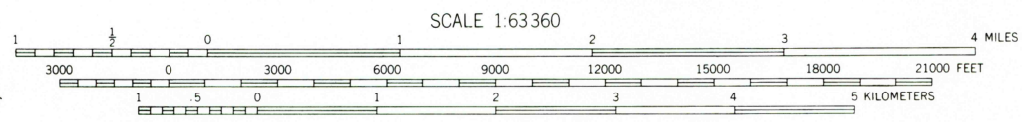
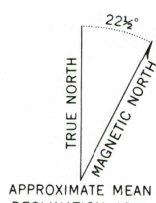
KODIAK (C-5) QUADRANGLE
