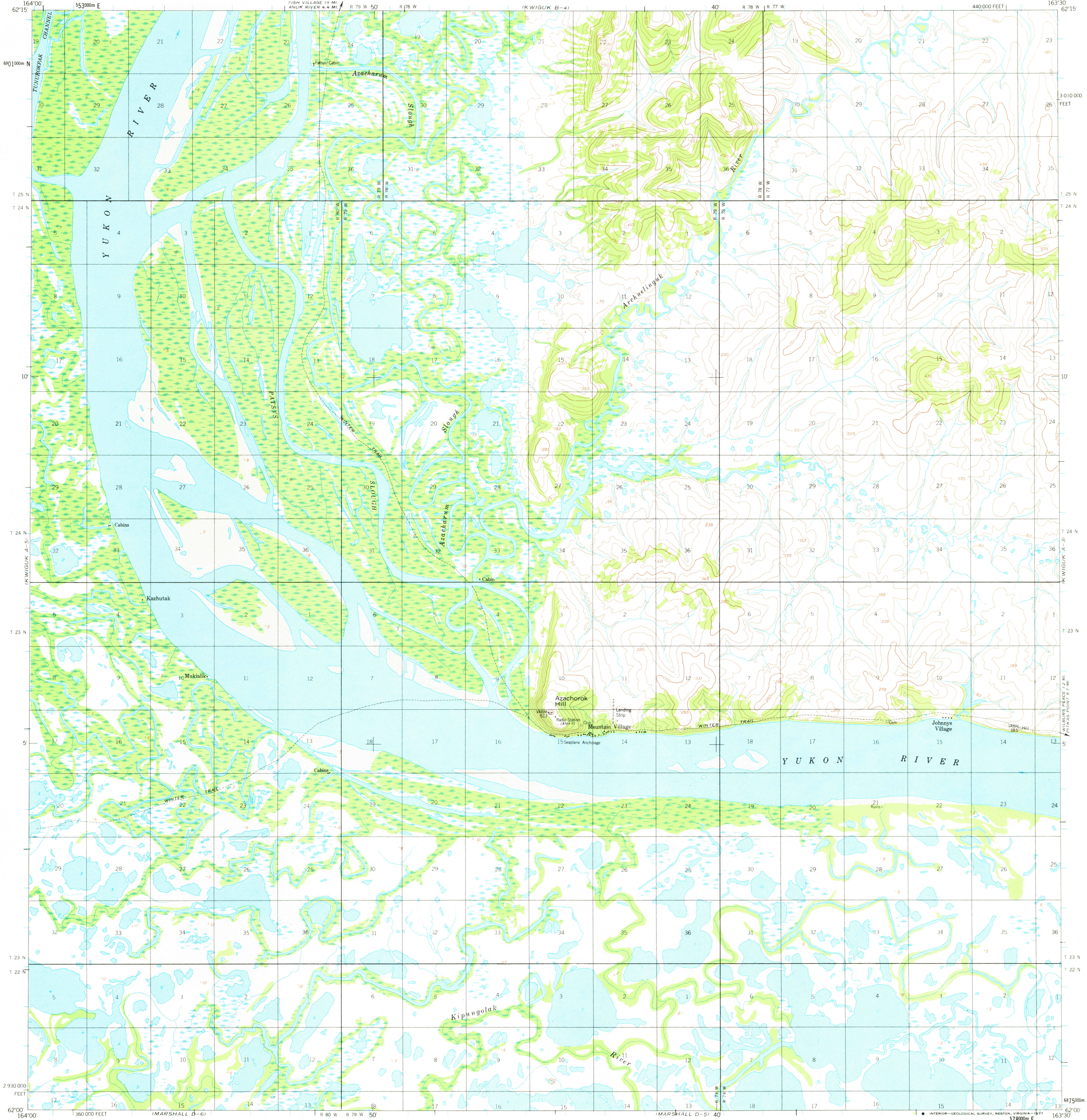
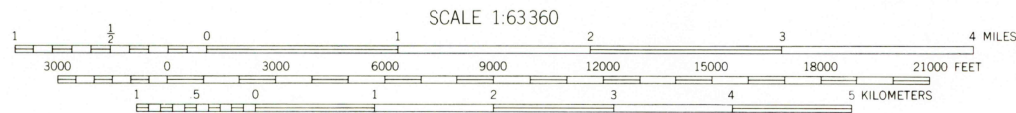

Folio S-6, Seward Meridian

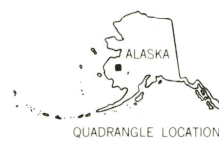
