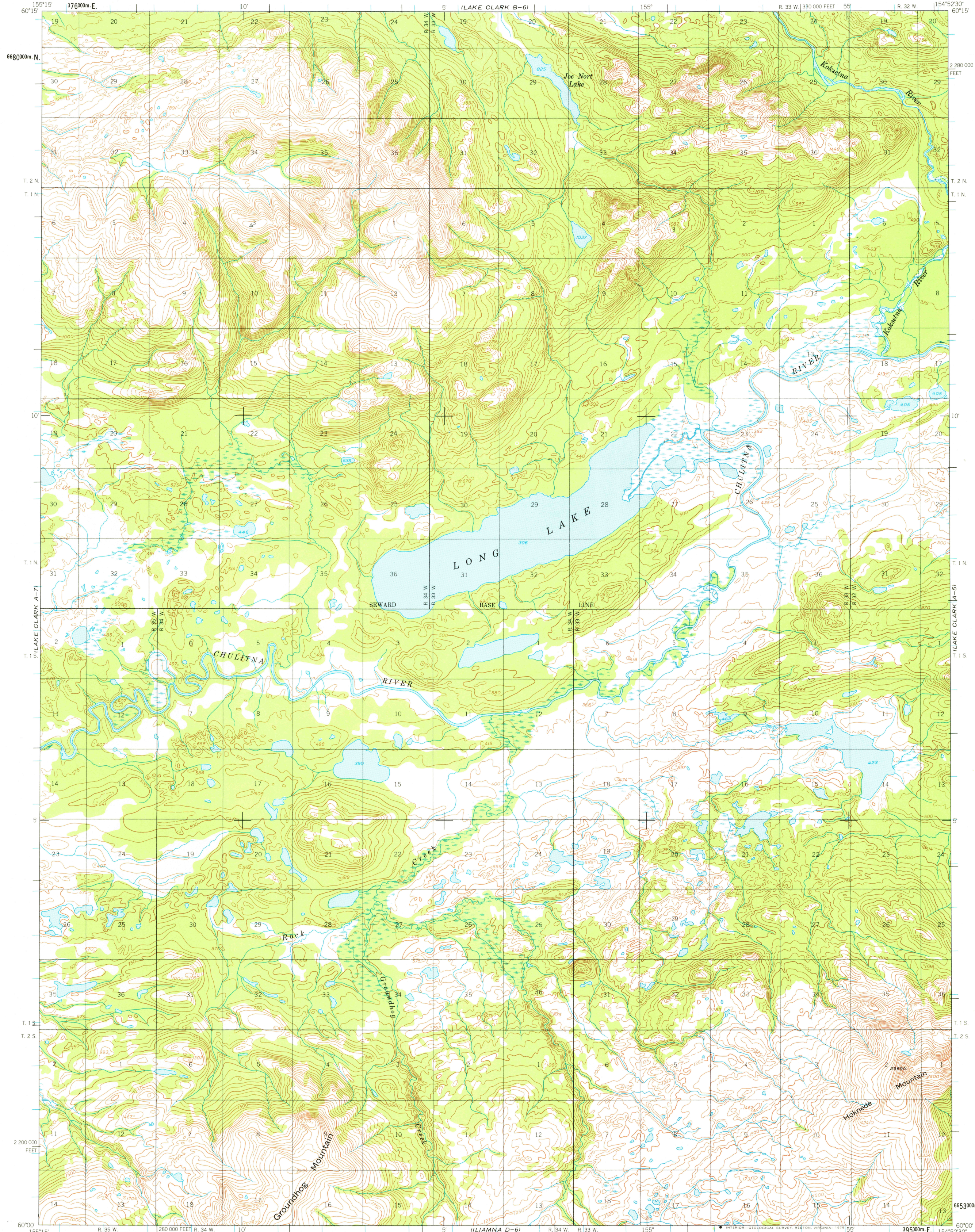

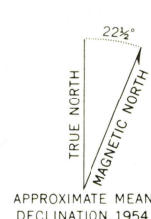

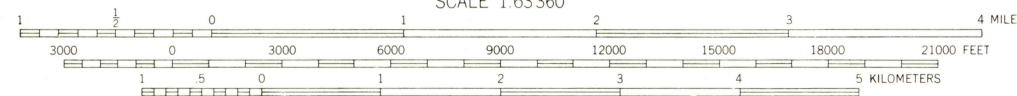
Universal Transverse Mercator projection, 1927 North American datum
