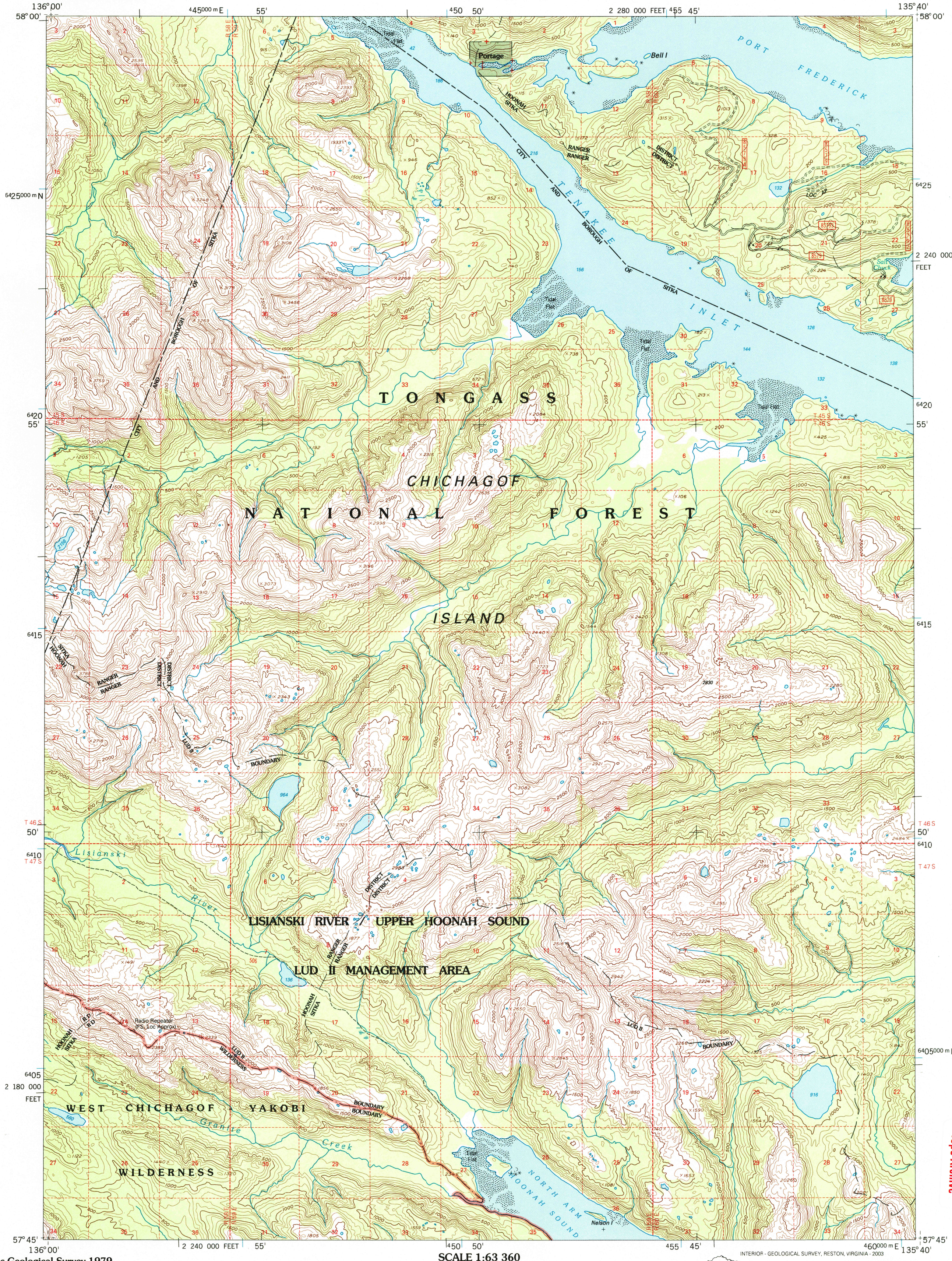

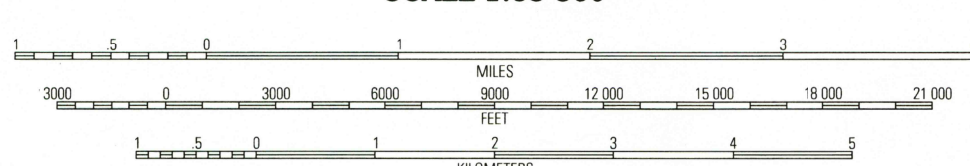
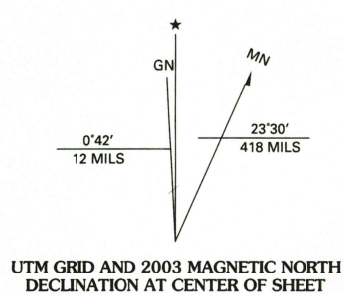
North American Datum of 1927 (NAD 27). Projection and 20 000-foot ticks: Alaska coordinate system, zone 1 (transverse Mercator)

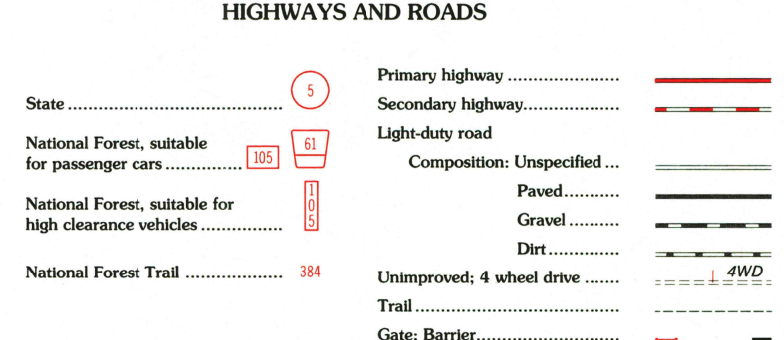
